Administrative Note

The Leopoldine Society was established on May 13, 1829 in Vienna. Its purpose was to pray for and send alms for missions in North America. Principal beneficiaries were the dioceses of the United States. The bishops were to distribute the alms where most needed.

Scope and Content *a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.*

The reports generally consist of letters mainly sent by bishops in the United States to Vienna. Information in the reports refers to the material and spiritual conditions of the Catholic Church in the U.S. Statistics are scattered throughout the reports which also contain comments on the social, economic and political climate of the time. They reflect on Catholic life, organizations, growth, needs, problems, and activities in religious, educational and charitable spheres.

The reports are nationwide in their coverage. Activities in Michigan, Ohio, Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Wisconsin, and Minnesota make up most of the reports. The collection also includes letters from missionaries as well as interesting reports regarding Civil War experiences. The collection consists of English translations from original German documents. The whereabouts of the source documents is unknown.
