## **Noel** Restoring Christmas for Sagrada Familia

Tropical Storm Noel (which is French for Christmas) hit *La Sagrada Familia Parish* in late October. More than 20 inches of rain fell over four days, washing away crops, roads, and homes. The village of Kilometer 15 must be completely relocated and rebuilt because of the storm.

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee is working to restore the lives and homes of families in Sagrada Familia, and, in so doing, restore the joy of the word "Noel" during this holy season.
