FROM THE VICAR FOR CLERGY

As you may have heard, Rick Tank has made the decision to retire at the end of December of this year. Rick has served in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee for over thirty years and has been such a valuable asset to so many priests, parish directors and parish staff members. His work for the past thirteen years as the Director of Priest Placement has served us all very well. I wish to thank Rick for his service, his dedication and his friendship. I'm sure we all wish him well as he gets ready to move into retirement.

With Rick's planned departure, it got me thinking about the transition not only with priest placement, but also with my position as Vicar for Clergy. I am in the midst of year number five serving as the Vicar for Clergy, and the Clergy Manual states it is a three year term, renewable once. As I prayed about my future, I decided to make a proposal to the Archbishop, which he has since accepted. I proposed that this year be my last year as Vicar for Clergy, but next year I would be willing to take over as the Director of Priest Placement on a part-time basis and then return to parish life on a part-time basis. As part of the proposal, I suggested that we hire another lay person to help manage the priest placement office.

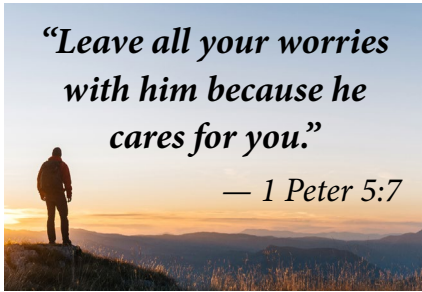
I am pleased to announce that Brenda Cline has agreed to serve as the Manager for the Priest

Placement office. While I will be the Director of the office, Brenda will carry out many of the responsibilities that Rick is currently overseeing in regards to priest placement, parish consultations, immigration issues for international priests, coordinating the Vatican II Awards, and she will also work very closely with the Parish Directors. To use a baseball analogy, I will be the "David Sterns" and she will be the "Craig Counsell" of our priest placement team.

As the Director of Priest Placement, one of the areas of emphasis for me will be bringing together our priest placement process and the parish planning process. It is my hope that we can do some

good long-term planning and make sure the needs of our priests and parishes are fully met.

Obviously someone will need to step into the role as Vicar for Clergy. This is a position appointed by the Archbishop. As has been done in the past, the Archbishop's office will do a consultation of the priests asking for names of who you think would be good for the Archbishop to consider to serve as the next Vicar for Clergy. From January 1 until June 30, 2022 I will serve in both positions, Vicar for Clergy and Director of Priest Placement, with the plan to have a new Vicar for Clergy in place on July 1, 2022. It has been a pleasure serving you during these five years, but I do look forward to getting back into parish ministry.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF DIACONATE FORMATION

CHANGE IS NORMAL...CHANGE IS EXPECTED

Very soon, perhaps as soon as you are reading this article, the New National Directory for the Formation, Ministry, and Life of Permanent Deacons in the United States will be published and promulgated. We already have advance notice that there will be changes required to our curriculum. Programs now will ordinarily

have two years of aspirancy rather than one. There will most certainly be other things, but this one will necessitate curriculum changes. Moreover, depending on the date of expected implementation, it may need to happen rather quickly. Therefore, you may imagine that I have been reflecting a lot on “change.” There are an incredible number of quotes available on change. I sifted through many and selected five quotes I found instructive as we anticipate the final wording that will influence our programmatic future:

“Everyone thinks of changing the world, but no one thinks of changing himself.” -Leo Tolstoy

“Keep your face to the sunshine and you cannot see a shadow.” -Helen Keller

“I can't change the direction of the wind, but I can adjust my sails to always reach my destination.” -Jimmy Dean

“The greatest discovery of all time is that a person can change his future by merely changing his attitude.” -Oprah Winfrey

“Change is the law of life, and those who look only to the past and present are certain to miss the future.” -John F. Kennedy

Why these five quotes? Well, it seemed to me that they provided a handful of wisdom for a Director of Diaconate Formation responsible to effect change. They suggest what credible leadership accountabilities ought to look like respectively:

- To be continuously open to the change required starting with me
- To look at the bright side of change versus what may appear to be dark
- To adjust our formation curriculum so that we reach the destination the USCCB has discerned
- To bear in mind that the future and my attitude are closely connected

- To be able to look beyond the past and the present toward the adventure of the new future the bishops envision

The publishing of the new National Directory is an event that highlights change. What is important is to remember that change is always going. It has to. It has been just over fifty years since the restoration of the permanency of the diaconate and it took a number of studies to bring us this far. More studies and the accompanying revisions will follow. Not to mention the change always needed to address the needs of the local Church.

Amidst change is all the incredible support from so many here at Mary Mother of the Church Pastoral Center...such a blessing. I am also so grateful to God to be in the company of two wonderful Associate Directors, Manuel Maldonado-Villalobos and Maritza Espino, and our newest team member Jenny Michaels, Administrative Assistant. With all that support, it is easy to welcome change!

IN THE PATH OF DIACONATE FORMATION

As Fall approaches we, in our Diaconate Formation Program, are getting ready to start a new formation year. We want to take this opportunity to give you some information on our program.

New Administrative Assistant: On July 6, 2021, we welcomed Jenny Michaels to our Formation Team. She has been learning our process and logistics. You will learn more

about her as she introduces herself in this edition of the newsletter.

Committee on Admission and Scrutiny (COAS): As time changes some members of this committee started new paths in their lives and new members have been welcome to continue the mission of helping the diaconate formation program in evaluating and discerning the call of the men in formation. We are grateful for the dedication and wisdom of all the members, former and active.

Candidate classes 2022 and 2024: After a process of prayer and discernment, the COAS passed the recommendations to our Archbishop, Most Reverend Jerome E. Listecky, for his selection of the deacon candidates. With great joy, we announce that sixteen candidates will move forward to the formation path of Candidacy Year III, class of 2022. In addition to this, thirteen men will start their Candidacy Year I path as class of 2024. We welcome them and we ask for your continued support and prayers for our candidates and their families as they discern their call to the permanent diaconate.

Inquiry, Discernment and Application: We have been holding "Information Sessions" and "Discernment Sessions" around the Archdiocese and via ZOOM. As of today, we have around fifty men inquiring about the vocation to the permanent diaconate. This is a low number compared to other years. Maybe due to the COVID-19 pandemic. If you want to host an "Information Session" at your parish, feel free to contact us. We will be happy to present. The last set of discernment sessions will be scheduled for this Fall 2021 before starting the application process in January 2022. We thank you for your continued support and promotion of the vocation to the permanent diaconate. Promotional material or information is available by contacting the Diaconate Formation Office.

Last but not least: With humble heart, I have to talk about myself now. On September 11, 2021, I will be ordained

to the Sacred Order of Deacons through the imposition of hands of our Ordinary, the Most Reverend Jerome E. Listecky, Archbishop of Milwaukee. The celebration will begin at 10:00 am at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Milwaukee. It is with great joy that I received this mission of service to the Church. Pray for me, so I can be a faithful servant to God's people.

As we move forward to our next cycle this Fall, we are very grateful first to God that has allowed us to continue the formation program without interruption, to our Archbishop for his continued trust and support, to our faculty, and to you for your prayer and help in promoting this vocation of service to the Church.

COMPANIONS IN MINISTRY

Companions in Ministry (CiM) is an ecumenical support program for Christian pastors and ordained deacons in southeastern Wisconsin. Sponsored by Marquette University, the program offers five cohorts, and is funded by a grant from the Lilly Endowment, Inc. Fifty-two pastors from various denominations are involved at this time. We invite you to consider applying for Cohort Five, which begins with a retreat on October 26 and 27, 2021.

CiM engages pastors in retreat days, plenary sessions, spiritual accompaniment, small group discussions about clergy well-being and resiliency, assessment, and the "Shared Inquiry" methodology. In addition to their self-care and Sabbath rest, participants explore topics such as Ignatian Spirituality, leading congregations during a pandemic, racial justice, serving multiple congregations, leading small congregations, serving in specialized ministries, bi-vocational pastors, female pastors and seasoned pastors. Small groups meet virtually and in-person (determined by COVID-19). Expenses are fully-funded and participants receive a stipend upon completing the 18-month program. Fr. Gerardo Raúl Cárcar, I.Sch., D.Min.

FR. GERARDO RAÚL CÁRCAR

I am an Argentine priest from the community of the Schoenstatt Fathers.

I was born in a little town in the Pampas in Cordoba, Argentina. After studying architecture for two years and having had a strong spiritual experience, I felt the call to the priesthood.

All my training of ten years was in Germany. I did exercise the priestly ministry in various countries and in very diverse tasks. In Argentina I worked pastorally in a parish, in the youth ministry of the Schoenstatt movement, giving theology classes to students of the Catholic University. After ten years I was transferred to Paraguay, where I had similar tasks.

I came to study in Chicago in the D.Min program of CTU, and thus I was able to make contact with the culture, the society and the Church of the USA.

For six years I moved to Rome, Italy, where I was a parish priest of the parish of St. Francis and Saint Catherine, in front of the Trastevere Station.

During the next six years I was in charge of the Instituto Maria de Nazareth in Cordoba, Argentina, and the last three years I was director of spiritual formation in the hispanic permanent deacon formation program, in the Mundelein seminary, Archdiocese of Chicago.

Since July 10 I'm appointed administrator at Holy Assumption West Allis.

FR. ADAM FERNANDEZ HIRUDAYASAMY

I am Fr. Adam Fernandez Hirudayasamy. I come from India. I have my parents and I have four siblings: three sisters and a brother. I belonged to Society of African mission (SMA). This society was founded on 8th December 1856 in Lyons, France by Bishop Melchior De Marion Bresillac. The Society is not a religious institute, but rather it is a society of apostolic life. The charism of the society is primarily evangelization; members commit themselves to a solemn

resolution, to be witnesses of the Gospel to the ends of the earth, particularly by serving the people of Africa.

Altogether I spent 15 years in Africa. I did my four years of theological studies in Kenya and one year of pastoral work in Tanzania. I was ordained in my home parish in 2002 and after my ordination I was sent to Zambia, the place called Zambezi, which belongs to Solwezi Diocese.

After two years of mission in Zambezi I was sent to Kenya in 2004. I was appointed in St. Monica Catholic Church as Pastor in a town called Kitengela. This town is situated in Masai land, about 30 kms away from the capital city Nairobi. This parish had a middle school and 15 outstations. I served in this parish for eight years.

In 2012 I went back to India and there I was appointed as the Rector of our SMA minor seminary. I was involved in the formation of students who just begin their lives with SMA after their school studies. Now I am happy to come to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and work in St. Joseph Catholic Church, Wauwatosa.

REV. MATTHEW PERUMPIL

I was born in 1968, May 26, in a small village in Kerala, India. After my high school I joined the Minor Seminary in 1983 of the Order of St. Camillus. From a very young age I wanted to be a priest and be like St. John Maria Vianney, whose biography inspired me, along with the encouragement of my grandfather. I entered the novitiate in 1989 and made my first profession in 1990 as a Camillian

Religious. My religious order was founded by St. Camillus with a special focus on caring for the sick and suffering and our charism is to serve the sick even in danger to our lives.

After my theological studies I was ordained a priest in 1994 and began my ministry in a parish as an associate. After one year I served as the Rector of our major seminary and in 1997 I came to Milwaukee to be trained in Pastoral Care. I did my CPE training at St. Luke's and became a board-certified chaplain in 1998. I then pursued my CPE program

in Boston to be a Certified CPE Educator and after my certification went back to India in 2002.

In India I was involved in various ministries: teaching pastoral care, animating and leading the HIV Care program, animating the Order as its provincial leader, and coordinating the healthcare ministry of the Catholic Church in India as the Health Secretary of the Bishop's Conference of India.

I came back to Milwaukee in 2019 to our community in Wauwatosa and started working here as the Mission Integration Director in our Life Plan Community for seniors. I was appointed as the Administrator of Mother of Perpetual Help Parish, West Allis, from June 15, 2021. I am excited for this opportunity to serve the Church in this new role.

Back home I have my mother and four siblings, three sisters and one brother. My father passed to eternal life 4 years ago.

REV. RANDALL KNAUF, OFMCAP

An active church family, LeRoy and DeLoris Knauf of Marathon, Wisconsin welcomed a newborn son on the 2nd of November 1960 with baptism just a few days later. LeRoy was ordained a Permanent Deacon in the Diocese of LaCrosse where he made his home on a corner of the family farm. LeRoy was also the nephew of Fr. Edwin Knauf, a priest and later Monsignor of the Diocese of LaCrosse and Fr. Edwin was the nephew of Fr. Leo Lang, also a priest of the Diocese of LaCrosse. Randall joined the Capuchin Province of St. Joseph in 1982 and was ordained a priest in June of 1991. Randall counts himself as being the fourth generation of ordained ministers from his family. In addition there are also family members who were members of the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in LaCrosse, the Salvatorian Sisters, and Randall's sibling, Sr Barbara Knauf, is a member of the Franciscan Sisters of St. Joseph of Stevens Point, Wisconsin.

Most recently he pastored clusters of parishes in the Diocese of Superior Wisconsin where multiple churches in parish clusters is common. Randall has ministered in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee through Catholic schools at Messmer Schools and St. Lawrence Seminary in Mount Calvary, Wisconsin where he again takes up residence at the newly forming parish of Our Lady of the Holyland.

PROPERTY OF PRIEST & PARISH

Canon law expresses an expectation about clarity of ownership by administrators of church property. It is ideal that a full inventory of parish property be maintained and regularly updated in accord with Canon 1283, §2. Property at parishes should be categorized as either the priest's personal property or else the property of the parish.

Parishes, e.g. finance office / trustees, are to maintain and annually update a list of parish-owned property.

Similarly, pastors / associate pastors / administrators / parish directors are to carefully maintain an inventory of their personal furnishings, appliances, vestments, vessels, office equipment and any other tangible property (not including clothing). This list is to be updated, and annually signed by one of the parish trustees. Items not contained on this list are considered parish property and the priest / parish director (or the family estate) has no right to items that are not contained on this "Personal Property" inventory list.

In lieu of written forms, a video format with audio descriptions of property for this inventory is an acceptable option.

In accord with canonical norms, one copy of the parish inventory, whether in written or video format, is to be maintained in the parish files and one submitted to the Chancery for filing.

Items to include are works of art, items of significant cultural value, movable items of sufficient monetary value including these items: televisions, VCR / CD players, computers, printers, etc. Include a photocopy of appraisal for items that are unique. Video, digital discs or photographs can be attached to supplement any worksheets.

ACTIVE & SENIOR PRIESTS RETREAT

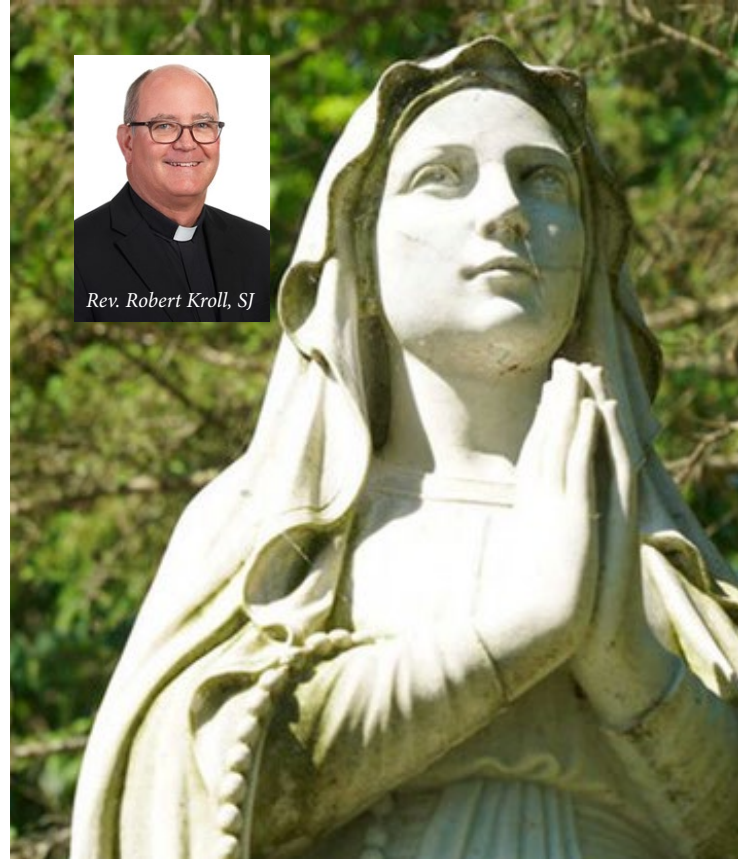

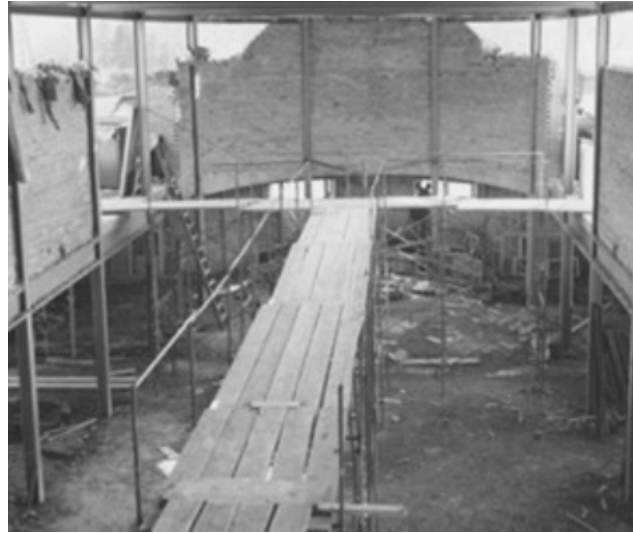

A LOOK BACK...

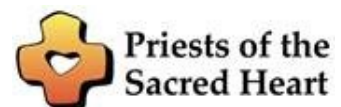

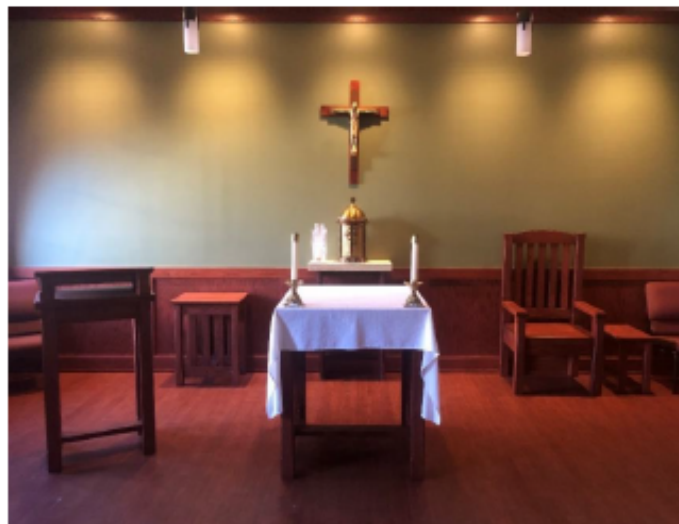

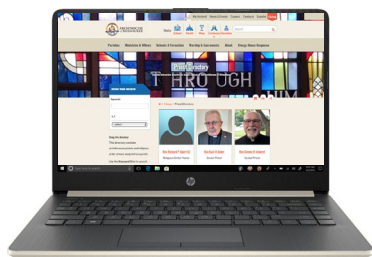
