Dear Priests and Parish Directors,

Last year, the Archdiocesan Council of Priests received a resolution from one of our senior priests requesting increases to the help-out compensation for priests in the Archdiocese since they had not been adjusted in many years. He also reasoned that some of our senior priests depend on these compensations to make ends meet.

The resolution was passed on to the Administration and Structures committee to examine and make recommendations to the Council. After consulting with neighboring dioceses in the Wisconsin Ecclesiastical province, they determined that our current compensation is not lagging behind the other dioceses. Hence, they recommended a modest increase to account for inflation.

The Council shared this information with you at the deanery meetings and gave you opportunity to discuss the recommended increases. Your feedback showed that majority were in favor of the recommendations.

Having received your feedback, the Council approved the recommendations with minor adjustments. Archbishop Listecki approves these recommendations.

Hence, beginning in the 2023-24 fiscal year, the help-out compensation for priests in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee would be as follows:

Weekend Masses \$70 plus stipend and mileage (determined by the IRS)

Weekday Masses \$50 plus stipend and mileage (determined by the IRS)

Reconciliation, Funeral vigil, etc., \$40 per session plus mileage (determined by the IRS)

The compensations would be reviewed by the Administration and Structures committee every three years and recommendations made to the Archdiocesan Council of priests.

Note that stipends and stole fees are set by the Wisconsin bishops.

Please, share this information with your parish staff and finance council so they would plan accordingly.

I thank everyone who contributed to this process and also thank you for your ministry to God's people in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.
