our extern priests and religious order priests who occupy a valuable place in our archdiocesan life here in Milwaukee, and of course to our senior priests whose daily generosity allow us to maintain the sacramental coverage that we have. This listing represents layers and layers of Gospel-inspired generosity that is truly inspiring.

As we look to the appointments for

coming years, we will continue to organically link our placement process with our ongoing planning process across the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in order to best utilize our resources. I would envision this to be a slow and gradual realigning of more local areas (case by case) with parishes linked as clusters under a pastor, together with one or more associate pastors, so that

we can lessen our current number of what I term "administrative centers" of parish life. We've been doing this for many years now each year, and I expect it will

gradually continue until we reach a more comfortable equilibrium of required pastorates across the whole archdiocese. This is a reality that will continue to rely on everyone's generosity, flexibility, and patience as we deal with constantly shifting variables. It is more of a "mindset" than it is a "master plan" at this point. I invite everyone's prayers and openness as we all keep walking that pathway together.



FROM THE DIRECTOR OF DIACONATE FORMATION

THE ROLE OF THE PASTOR AND PARISH COMMUNITY IN ADMISSION AND SELECTION PROCEDURES FOR THE ASPIRANT PATH

"The inquirer who seeks consideration for ordination to the diaconate needs to enter in to dialogue with his parish community. It

is the pastor who initially presents him for consideration into diaconal formation..." (National Directory for the Formation, Ministry, and Life of Permanent Deacons in the United States of America - NDFMLPD No. 182)

I am picking up where my last article left off. Once a man, and if married, his wife, has completed an intake, attended the full discernment series (four sessions), and has been determined to be free of canonical impediments or irregularities, an Endorsement Packet may be requested from Diaconate Formation. At this point, the inquirer has already

been in dialogue with the parish community and, in particular, his pastor for some time. I say this because the Endorsement Packet is the vehicle for the pastor to present him for consideration into diaconal formation. It is through meeting with the man, or couple if married, and filling out the packet that the pastor "confirms he is a practicing Catholic of good repute and in good standing." It will also "attest that the man shows evidence of the qualities, attitudes, experience, and spirituality deemed necessary for admission into formation, namely:

- a. He is actively involved in parish and other community service.
- b. He is in full communion with the Church (at least five years should elapse between a convert's or returning Catholic's entry into the Church and his acceptance into formation; care must be given to someone in whom a sudden conversion experience seems to



- precipitate a diaconal vocation).
- c. He is in a stable marriage, if married, or in a mature celibate state of life, if single.
- d. If married, he has the consent of his wife.
- e. He is properly motivated and gives evidence of an overall personal balance and moral character.
- f. He is a frequent participant in adult faith enrichment opportunities (e.g., retreats, days of reflection, spiritual direction, study of Scripture and church teachings).
- g. He is free of canonical impediments or irregularities" *NDFMLPD No.182.* (In the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, we do this step prior to endorsement).

Once the inquirer is presented to the diocese by his pastor, an application is provided and "the formal process for admission begins. This initial discernment continues with particular focus on the applicant's abilities and potential for ordained ministry. Both the applicant and the diocesan Church enter into an intensive screening process." *NDFMLPD No.181*

I appreciate the wonderful support pastors are to men currently in the formation program. And I look forward to a whole new group of aspirants and their families that will begin classes in September 2024. Soon you will be receiving rack cards to help with promoting this incredible ministry (pictured above). If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Diaconate Formation.

NEW RESOURCE COMING SOON – ONLINE MASS ATTENDANCE SURVEY

Mass attendance is an important source of information for our priorities of **Catholic Identity**, **Evangelization**, and **Stewardship**, and the missionary planning to act on those priorities. Knowledge of continuous Mass counts provides valuable data as an indicator of parish health and vibrancy – sharing the gift of Sunday, deepening relationships with Jesus Christ, and spreading our faith. Knowledge of seasonal trends also provides planning information for evangelization efforts.

Beginning in July 2023 – the start of the new fiscal year – and every month thereafter, all parishes will be asked to facilitate an *actual count* of the number of people, *both children and adults*, attending weekend Masses, both on Saturdays and Sundays. Parishes sharing a pastor will be asked to record actual counts of each of the Masses at each of the parishes. Individual parishes with multiple sites should record actual counts for each of the Masses at all locations.

A new online report form is being created to easily record and submit Mass counts on a monthly basis. Instructions for using the new form will be sent to each parish prior to July 1, 2023.




