Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As some of you may know, April has been declared Sexual Assault Awareness Month in the state of Wisconsin. Why is this important to us? Well, as most Roman Catholics know, sexual assault crimes can happen anywhere and to anyone, especially to our most vulnerable populations. Through the sexual abuse crisis in the Catholic Church, we have seen the safety and security we once took for granted in our sacred sanctuaries diminish. Victims, their loved ones, clergy colleagues of accused priests and bishops, and every member of the congregation has lost a valued sense of trust as the dark confusion of this crime was revealed. At times, many of us have felt hopeless and overwhelmed...where will all of this lead? Where is God in all of this?

And yet, this same month of April, this same month of Sexual Assault Awareness, offers each of us a way through the darkness of human sin and into the light of God's loving mercy and grace. Holy Week reminds us each year about the power of sin, the nature of great suffering, the nature of great sacrifice given in love, and the power of freedom in redemption. As we follow Christ this Holy Week, let us have the courage to stand with Him in His moments of abuse and torture, in His suffering and physical diminishment, in His wish to "let this cup" pass him by. This April, may we all have the courage to follow Christ to the Light that comes into the darkness, thus inspiring us to continue to have the courage to follow those harmed by our Church to the Light of healing and redemption.

If you or someone you know was abused as a minor by church personnel and is now an adult, the Victim Assistance Coordinator is available to obtain support and make a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese. You may also report as an adult directly to the civil authorities. If the abused person is currently under 18 years of age (minor) please report directly to the civil authorities.
