Former altar boy alleges sex abuse

41-year-old man says contact began at an orphanage in the 1960s

By MICHAEL R. ZAHN of The Journal staff

A 41-year-old Pulaski man has filed a lawsuit against a 63-year-old Milwaukee priest, claiming that the priest sexually abused him while he was an altar boy in an orphanage here in the 1960s and that their sexual relationship ended only a couple of years ago.

The Pulaski man's attorneys identify their client only by the pseudonym Roger Roe.

The priest said Monday that the allegations were not true. "My

gosh, I don't have any information about this at all," he said.

The Milwaukee Archdiocese and its charitable arm, Catholic Social Services, are also named as defendants. The Circuit Court suit claims they "knew or should reasonably have known" of the priest's alleged conduct.

Greg Bell, spokesman for the archdiocese, said Monday that the archdiocese had not yet been served with the legal papers, and that he therefore could not comment on the lawsuit.

The suit, which does not seek a specific amount for damages, was brought by Jeffrey R. Anderson, a lawyer from St. Paul, Minn., who specializes in sexual exploitation lawsuits against clergy, and by Mil-

waukee attorney Don C. Prach-thauser.

It says the plaintiff and his siblings were placed in an orphanage here when he was 10 years old and that he stayed at the orphanage until 1968, when he turned 18. The priest began having sexual contacts with the plaintiff in 1961, when the boy was 11, the lawsuit claims.

The priest and the plaintiff continued to have sexual contact until two years ago, the suit alleges. At that time, it says, the plaintiff came to the conclusion that the relationship had caused him psychological harm.

Prachthauser said the plaintiff "has held a number of part-time jobs over the years, but he has not had steady employment." Confidential



Dear Eldred:

Before too much times elapses I thought it would be good to commit to writing what we discussed on July 7, 1983 concerning a number of topics including the need for an additional priest at Blessed Sacrament Parish.

I guess my first concern is for you and for your health especially. Some of our fellow priests have also expressed this same concern and feel that you are obviously overweight and probably experiencing blood pressure problems. There has undoubtedly been a great deal of stress and tension over the last three years resulting from your transition from Catholic Social Services to the routine of a large parish. The Archbishop and I want you to let us know if Blessed Sacrament is too much for you to handle reasonably. It would be much wiser to be in a less stressful assignment than to burn yourself out. You know that you and we have a moral obligation to consider this and act on it if necessary.

In our meeting we also discussed your administrative actions at the parish. From a financial standpoint you admitted that you neglected to obtain from the Archbishop the proxies which are necessary to expend amounts that exceed \$1,500.00 for extraordinary matters. This is a matter of both ecclesiastical and civil law and lets you open to serious criticism. We cannot support you in this area unless you cooperate and all it takes is one irate parishioner of trustee and you could face a lot of embarrassment. I asked you to write to the Arhhbishop about these matters so that proxies can be issued, even retroactively. I do not believe either the Archbishop or Bishop Brust has heard from you yet.

From the standpoint of administrative organization and consultation, evidently, a parish council has not yet been started. Frankly, this surprises me because I remember so well before you were assigned how you stated that establishing a parish council and working with one would pose absolutely no problem since you were accustomed to working with several boards and councils at CSS. I had expected that the parish council would have been your first project at Blessed Sacrament. Recently, when Father Roscioli left the parish, some of the parishioners expressed

strong feelings about the lack of a parish council and the Renew Program in which they could participate. You will recall that at our meeting I told you Archbishop Weakland had decided that you were not to undertake any projects until a council is formed.

When we discussed the possibility of another associate, Father Lijewski's opinion was that it would be disastrous if a priest were appointed and then would leave in a manner similar to the last two. Tom felt that the parishioners would never stand for that, and consequently, no one should be assigned. I feel Tom is absolutely right; however, given the size of the parish and its outstanding people, the parish should receive another priest. Besides, if a parish council is established according to diocesan criteria and the Renew Program begun, there will be a much greater need for the services of another priest to help enable the laity to assume their rightful role in the parish.

The question which remained as the meeting ended was how to go about the process of finding an associate.pastor. This is a bad time of the year since the spring assignments have been made and most priests have been situatedd If we open list the assignment and no one applies, the parishioners will feel badly and maybe even angry. I told you that I would discuss the matter with the Personnel Board and suggest that perhaps one of the priests awaiting assignment might be interested and willing. I also suggested that you and Tom feel free to ask priests of your choosing to apply. To date, no one has applied and the Personnel Board feels that we need to see more action on your part especially by way of establishing a parish council before the position is open listed.

Basically, that is my recall from my notes of our meeting which, I felt, was a good one and evidenced excellent cooperation on your part. All of us now need to get busy and work together so that good things can happen. I stand ready and willing to continue to discuss these matters. First, however, I ask you again to straighten out the proxy matters. Secondly, I would hope that you contact the Parish Council Office for advice in setting up a timeline for the proper implementation of a parish council. Finally, you have my assurance that I will do everything possible to see to it that another priest is assigned to the parish when attention is given to the above matters.

I am thanking you in advance for your collaboration.



- 8. This Agreement supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the parties, and constitutes the full agreement of the parties. No change to this Agreement shall be enforced against any party unless it is in writing signed by both parties.
- 9. The undersigned represent and warrant that each has read the foregoing Agreement; had an opportunity to discuss it with a lawyer; and fully understands its terms; voluntarily, freely, and without coercion signs the Agreement; and that Dr. Barbara Anne Cusack is an authorized representative of the Archdiocese and is duly authorized to execute this Agreement and Mutual Release. Since both sides have had an opportunity to review this instrument with a lawyer of his or its choosing, in the event this instrument needs to be construed, it shall be construed and understood as it is written and without regard or preference as to which party served as the drafter of the same.

AGREEMENT AND MUTUAL RELEASE

This Agreement and Mutual Release (hereafter "Agreement") is made by and between and the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Milwaukee, and all of its affiliated entities, institutions, schools, and parishes (hereafter "Archdiocese").

and the Archdiocese entered into mediation to achieve reconciliation and restoration, to help repair the harm to to to address issues of concern to about prevention of sexual abuse of minors in the future and reformation of Church practices in this regard, and to otherwise resolve and settle all disputes between them.

Accordingly, the parties to this Agreement wish to resolve and satisfy all claims of any nature that has against the Archdiocese, and all of the Archdiocese's employees, agents, officers, directors, affiliates, insurers, and assigns, including, without limitation, all members of the Roman Catholic clergy and all parishes, schools, and religious orders, and any person or entity affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church in the territory of the Archdiocese, arising from the sexual abuse of by Lesniewski without the necessity of further proceedings or expense of any nature, and all parties wish to generally release one another from all liability for any claims that may exist to the date of the signing of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, any claims for sexual abuse of the signing by Lesniewski.

So, in consideration of the mutual promises made here, and other valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties to this Agreement agree as follows:

- 1. The Archdiocese agrees to research the status of the of

 If it has not yet been declared invalid, the Archdiocese will assist in applying

 for such a declaration. The Archdiocese cannot guarantee the outcome of the case.
- 2. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee agrees to provide payment for counseling for to address issues resulting from this abuse. The Archdiocese shall make payments to the counselor for reasonable costs, billed at the counselor's usual and customary rate.

 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement, the Archdiocese's therapy payments owed under this provision shall be based upon treatment plans submitted by and his counselor. This payment for treatment shall continue for five (5) years, through June 30, 2010, at which time it will be reviewed for possible renewal by the Archdiocese.
- 3. The Archdiocese recognizes desire to support renewed faith by helping others with similar backgrounds. The Archdiocese agrees to inform Amy Peterson, Victim Assistance Coordinator, of desire and interest in assisting this work.
- 4. The Archdiocese agrees to provide with \$60,000 in reimbursement for past medical and therapy expenses incurred as a result of injuries inflicted by Lesniewski.
- 5. The Archdiocese agrees to provide with \$40,000. These funds shall be used at the own discretion.

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- 6. The total of all funds to shall total \$100,000 as delineated in paragraphs 4 and 5.
- 7. and the Archdiocese will each bear their own costs and any attorney's fees associated with the Agreement, and there will be no payment to than that specifically enumerated above.

4/10/10 Sexual Abuse Intake Report from a survivor of abuse by Lesniewski who reports that Lesniewski abused him in 1961-1964, beginning when he was 11 years old at St. Joseph's Orphanage. Lesniewski wrestled with him and fondled him over and under his clothes on approximately five occasions.
