Dear Siegfried,

This letter is written to you to follow our telephone conversation Wednesday morning. This relates to the recommendation of the Personnel Board at its meeting of October 26th. After I spoke with you, I called the Archbishop, who is aware of this direction and supports its intent.

The Personnel Board recommends a choice. First, that you pursue significant counseling to assist you in coming in touch with yourself about the action that has brought about a hasty exit from your last two assignments. Specifically, the House of Affirmation was suggested at the Board meeting and such information was given to you via the phone. Subsequent to such therapy, you would be considered for an appointment within the Archdiocese. The alternative would be for you to be released to the services of another diocese; with the permission of the Archbishop, you would request to minister elsewhere. Should you select the second alternative, the Board would ask periodic reports about your status.

You are confronted toward a decision by the Board, in what we hope is very positive toward dealing with your present situation. You may well decide to seek consultation from others like basically you will need to decide.

Your present status with the Archdiocese is delicate. Subsequently, your salary, insurance, and all other benefits need to be clarified. We suggest that you contact Father Sampon to finalize your present situation. Be assured that help is available to assist you through all of this. On the other hand, you may need to look to helping out in a priestly way during this duration, to get some method of financial income. The Chancellor, Father Sampon, would be able to direct you relating to faculties and benefits. His address is P. O. Box 2018, 345 North 95th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 53201.

We do ask that underneath all of what is stated, that you are assured of our interest in you. You are a generous and loving man, who has served as a priest for almost ten years. At the same time, there is something within you that you need to give adequate attention to, so that you can take away the suspicion and mistrust within yourself that forces you to run away. The personnel Board is interested in being informed at the earliest possible time of your direction in all of this.

Dear Mr. Polidori:

This letter is being submitted on behalf of the above named 32 year old priest of the Milwaukee Archdiocese who was arrested on July 2, 1973, at 3:30 a.m. in the company of four minor males. Father Widera reports that the arrest took place on North Spring near Grand Avenue in Port Washington, Wisconsin. When it was alleged that Father Widera had had sexual contact with one of the minor males a charge of sexual perversion was made against him by District Attorney La Pointe of Ozaukee County and it is my understanding that the case is to come to trial on July 16, 1973, at 8:30 a.m. It is also my understanding that bail was posted for Father Widera by Father Rolland T. Glass, the pastor of St. Mary Church in Port Washington, the parish to which Father Widera had been assigned.

Archbishop Cousins, concerned about the stresses and strains that the event had subjected Father Widera to, referred him to me in a telephone conversation on July 3, 1973. Hoping to be of some service to Father Widera, to you his attorney, and to the court, Father was seen a total of seven times between July 3, 1973, and July 12, 1973. In addition to the beginnings of psychotherapy, extensive diagnostic evaluations were conducted and it is with these that the rest of the report shall concern itself.

Father Widera was first seen on the afternoon of July 3, 1973. Upon investigation he was a very anxious and upset very fair skinned male of 32 with a pronounced German accent. On that date and hence forward he has proved to be extremely cooperative and has been making a real and pronounced effort to cooperate with me in all areas pursued. From that date to this it would appear that the anxiety has abated somewhat but the residual depression and the very understandable fear of the court appearance and the disgrace to himself and to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee perdure.

Father provided the following history.

He was born in Germany on the 20th of December, 1940, which would be approximately the year that World War II started. He relates that his father, an engineer, removed his children to the country where they could sometimes see and hear the bombers overhead but Father can recall only an occasional instance when they were in fact forced to the bomb shelter. He can remember playing in the burned out and bombed out buildings, recalling that at the time they were more understood as toys than as tragedies of war.

Father Widera's father, the end of World War II he was invited to the United States by a large Milwaukee industrial firm because of his knowledge of the drop forge business. Father relates that his father was the designer of the largest drop forge hammers in the world. Mr. Widera spent a year in the United States deciding whether or not he wished to immigrate and at the end of approximately a year sent to Germany for the rest of his family who travelled to the United States in first class passage on the Queen Mary. Unfortunately for young Siegfried, who was then ten and about to enter the fourth grade, the trip is remembered more in terms of seasickness than luxury.

The family settled in South Milwaukee where Father recalls that the day after their arrival, wearing lederhosen, he and his brothers and sisters were enrolled in parochial school. Considering modern day concern over jet lag and culture shock it is interesting to note that the Widera children spoke not a word of English when they were dropped into the Sacred Heart Grade School in St. Francis, Wisconsin. Father Widera relates that the language came to him with facility.

Upon his graduation from grade school in June of 1955 he entered the St. Francis Minor Seminary the following September. He was further graduated from De Sales College in June of 1963 and from the St. Francis School of Pastoral Ministry in June of 1967. It was at that time that he was ordained to the priesthood.

He recounts that during high school he was active in sports and that during his college days he was a member (appropriately enough) of the German Society. He seems to have gone through school with about a B average in both high school and college. His interest in sports has continued after ordination and he still recounts his favorite recreations as golf, tennis, swimming, boating and ice skating.

The family relationships are described in prostac terms. His father, as indicated above, is an engineer and Father Widera sees

the two of them as sharing certain "mannerisms". Father thinks that his dad "gets along with those he works". On the other hand he sees his father as being somewhat impatient. The father and sen share some athletic interests in terms of fishing and golf and Mr. Widera is described by his son as being a benign and loving individual who is still somewhat ridden through with the stereotyped German rigidity. Father relates that Mr. Widera has been extremely upset and shaken over his son's arrest and plans to accompany him to Court for his moral support at the appointed time.

His mother, good health. At age 63 she is three years younger than her husband and both of them are cradle Catholics. She is seen by her son as a pleasant individual who is "able to get along real well with her friends". On the other hand, while her husband is impatient, she "jumps to conclusions--does not take that extra second to think". She spends her time working about the house, visiting with the neighbors, and attending various social activities.

Father Widera is the third oldest of four children. The father and mother's brightness have certainly been passed on to the children. In addition to Father Widera there is a 35 year old brother who received a doctorate in mathematics from the University of Wisconsin and another brother who received a bachelor of arts degree from Ferris University in Grand Rapids, Michigan. This brother is currently employed as a salesman. The youngest of the children is a 30 year old sister who received a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and is currently employed as an administrator of financial aids at the University of Illinois-Circle Campus in Chicago. All of the brothers and sisters seem to be making routine adjustments to the world about them and there is no indication that they are suffering from any more than the normal amount of stress in coping with the world about them.

This is Father Widera's third appointment since his ordination and he reports that all three of the pastors under whom he has served are cast somewhat in the age range and rigid temperament of his father.

Sometime was spent examining the history of Father Widera's inability to rid himself of the German overtones in his speech patterns. He relates that his brothers and sisters for the most part have made a better adjustment to deleting the German cast in their speech patterns and that while he was a student in the Seminary the Rector suggested that he attend the Marquette University School of Speech Pathology department to see if the teutonic overtones could be remedied. Inasmuch as the family has always continued to speak German at home it would appear that the design was ill-fated. While Father Widera speaks the English language with about as much verbal fluency and basic literacy as any other individual of his training and education, it is interesting to note that when reduced to the written and spelled word

he is in considerably more difficulty. As a case in point he lists his age as 22 rather than 32, relates that he and his father are alike "in mannerism" rather than stating in colloquial English "in mannerisms" or "in manners". It might be best said that his written use of the language is not illiterate but clumsy. He reports that in the verbal communication area he finds it extremely difficult to preach sermons extemporaneously and will sometimes tape record the Sunday homily on one of the two tape recorders that he owns in order to clarify his conceptualizations.

This led me to speculate on the fact that although Father Widera was basically literate in two languages I wondered if he was conceptually literate in either. For this reason three intelligence tests were administered. The results, I think, are worth considering:

- 1. On a thirty minute test of mental ability which has been used on millions of Americans since World War I and which is currently used on seminarians applying to study for the priesthood in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee Father Widera is awarded an I.Q. of 108. This places him in the average range of intelligence and it is interesting to note that the thirty minute time limit left him seventeen answers short of the 75 items. Had he had enough time to complete the test and to plow his way through the semantics, the I.Q. instead of 108 would have been 125.
- 2. Because of this a roughly equivalent test was administered to Father which relieved him of the time limit. On this particular test he earned an I.Q. of 133 which represents a 25 point discrepancy from the first test. This becomes a little tricky in terms of the I.Q. equivalencies but assuming that they are at least roughly equivalent the increase from his projected 125 to the earned 133 is not significant.
- Adult Intelligence Scale which is an individual intelligence test requiring a one-to-one relationship between the psychologist and Father Widera. The test was administered by Mrs. who is a psychologist in the Milwaukee area. I chose not to administer the test myself in order to get an independent opinion about Father Widera's intellectual functioning. The most salient finding of the individual intelligence test is that if one were to project Father Widera's working knowledge of English vocabulary he would find himself dealing with an individual whose I.Q. was less than the national average. When he is dealing with very simple verbal concepts such as basic information in simple terms or a basic comprehension of the culture in simple terms he performs very well. When he is forced to use the English language to abstract or when he is forced to define words in terms acceptable to dictionary usage he finds himself very severely damaged. As a result of this his verbal I.Q. on a carefully administered intelligence test is 111.

Like many people who were born to be verbal in one language or the other his performance score does not equal that of the verbal. This is especially accentuated because of an inability on his part to master material requiring new learning which is a function of the anxiety. As a result of this the full scale I.Q. on the individual intelligence test came out to 106. This in contrast to the 133 where he is completely free from pressure or the 108 where he is under a close time limit.

This led to additional investigation in terms of Father Wider&'s personality. The personality testing that was done on Father Widera is essentially within normal limits. It is not indicative of anyone who is experiencing extreme mental difficulties or emotional upheavals and there does not appear to be an even remote possibility that Father Widera is going to encounter what is commonly referred to as "mental illness". What the test is indicative of is an individual who handles his personality problems by essentially refusing to admit their existence and repressing into his unconscious whatever unpleasant vestiges of them remain. This is brought up because it ties in well with the confusion in intellectual functioning. When interviewed carefully Father Widera freely admitted that he found it extremely difficult to relate to other adults on an equal basis. One is reminded of the little boy in lederhosen, speaking no English. Inasmuch as he is unable to think comfortably (assopposed to clearly) in the English language there appears to have been a regression phenomenon back to the earlier days when he was relating well to his own peer group. Inasmuch as he stopped relating with his own peer group on the day he was dropped into the fourth grade of grammar school it is not awfully surprising to find out that he is now more comfortable with minor males than he is with either adult males or females. At some level there was an arresting of his psychosocial development at this level and this is the point to which Father Widera regresses when he is seeking companionship that is emotionally satisfying to him. If, in fact, the allegations against Father were true it would not be surprising inasmuch as the man would then express his sexuality in the area in which he was most comfortable as a social being. As unfortunate as it might be, he would find himself regressed to the level that he was when he came to the United States.

I would find father Widera an extremely good risk for psychotherapeutic intervention and he has already profitted and understood greatly from initial therapy sessions that we have held. I would not see him at the present time as a constant threat to the young people of the community nor would I see him as in any way representing a liability to himself or to the community in any other sphere.

If the Court sees fit to place Father Widera on probation it is his plan and mine to continue with the psychotherapy that we have

started so that he will in the future be able to relate to an adult population in a more adult fashion than he has been able to previously.



Dear Padre,

Please tell me things about being a priest. We used to have Father Murphy here . . . But the bishop changed him, and now the new priest is grouchy at us servers, and I'm afraid to ask him. . . .

Dear Tommy,

I'm not sure what it is that you would like to know. But let me say a little about the priesthood and about the seminary where young men prepare for becoming priests.

The priest is, first of all, a Christian like all the other people in the Church. He believes that he and all of us followers of Jesus must try to love and serve other people, just like Jesus did, and must try to make the world a better place to live.

Most people serve others by getting married and living for their children and for each other. They also help other people, too, by the jobs that they have and by lots of acts of charity, but their families are their first responsibility. But the priest wants to serve other people in a special way. He wants to help people love God better by preaching to them on Sunday. He wants to bring them the sacraments — Penance, Holy Communion, the Sacrament of the Sick — when they are in the hospital or sick at home. He wants to offer Mass, so that all the other Christians can come near the altar in church and can worship God their Father together and receive Jesus in Holy Communion together. These are some of the ways that a priest tries to make the world better. He helps other Christians grow in faith and hope and love, so that they, too, will keep trying to make the world better. The priest does not marry and raise a family of his own, but he helps all the dads and moms and kids become better in their families.

Boys and young men who think they would like to become priests go to a seminary. In the high-school seminary, they study English and science and math and all the other subjects. They play sports like kids do everywhere. But each day they also have time for prayer and for taking part in Mass and communion. There are priest-counselors there, and the seminarians talk things over with them. As time goes on, some of the boys decide that the priesthood is not what they really want, and they go back home. Others, on the contrary, become more convinced than ever that being a priest is exactly what they want to be. Of course, the final decision to be a priest is not made until the person is about 24 or 25 years old.

If you have any other questions you are not sure of, Tommy, just write again and ask about them. I am glad to answer you.

Sixty-eight years of daily MASS - Lawrence WELK

The man whose name is synonymous with "champagne music" has spent a lifetime in close proximity to sacrificial wine.

Lawrence Welk, the nation's most popular band-leader, has attended Mass daily since he was

five years old. He is now 73.

"I get so much good out of it," he declared.
"I believe in the Golden Rule and I believe in

the Ten Commandments. I believe in God and the guidelines that He has given us."
Welk was reared in a Catholic family in a North Dakota community that was 90 percent Catholic. That upbringing, he says, enabled him to cope with the reverses he encountered early in his career.

The worst occurred in the early 1930s in South Dakota. The members of his five-piece band approached him with an announcement. They were better than he was, they said, better speakers, better musicians. He was a hindrance. So they were going on without him, under a different

Welk had to choose between returning home in

disgrace to a father who had opposed his son's musical career, or going ahead on his own.

"I knew myself and I had faith that I could handle hard times and hard knocks," he said. "So just a few days after having lost my band, I made my decision to stick with it."

The rest, as they say, is history.

BEFORE AND SINCE, however, Welk has never let any personal inconvenience except illness stand between him and the nearest Catholic

"There have been countless times when going to church meant going through all sorts of storms in order to go to Mass, but I never let anything stop me," he said.

"Numberless times through the years as we traveled throughout the country I would result of the burney go got of the way to get to

foute the bus and go out of the way to get to a church. Those added miles must be in the thousands, but going to church was as natural and as important to me as breathing."

He added, "Many times I would call for a

breakfast stop, and while everyone else was eating his breakfast, I would go to Mass. I felt better when I did that."

Dear Father Driscoll,

A few days ago I talked by phone to Bishop Johnson about a possible pastoral assignment for Father Siegfried Widera of this Archdiocese. The conversation was very general and the Bishop suggested that perhaps something could be done on a temporary basis. My reason for approaching Bishop Johnson is founded in the fact that Father Widera's brother and family live in Costa Mesa, California. In the course of our conversation the Bishop informed me that he would be absent for a while and asked that I discuss the matter further with you.

I talked to Father Widera this morning and informed him that I was writing to you at the Bishop's request. I learned that he is leaving to visit his brother and will arrive in California on or about January 5th. Under the circumstances I recommended that upon his arrival he immediately get in touch with you or with the Bishop and that in the meantime I would have written to you and to His Excellency.

Father Widera was ordained in 1967 and has done good work for the Diocese in the places to which he was assigned. In his earlier years there was a moral problem having to do with a boy in school. This seemed adequately confronted through treatment and an intense desire upon Father's part to avoid any repetition of a previous offense.

More recently, however, there has been a repetition, and according to our State Laws further psychiatric treatment is mandated with the strong recommendation that no immediate assignment be made in the environs of the Archdiocese.

Father Widera has cooperated in every way and is presently under treatment. His doctor is somewhat in favor of his leaving the scene but expects that there will be continuing treatment. This has already been arranged and a doctor in California will take over at this point. From all the professional information I can gather there would seem no great risk in allowing this man to return to pastoral work, but there are legal complications at present writing. Incidentally, these legal technicalities would permit Father's going to another State as long as treatment is continued.

I would not expect Bishop Johnson or yourself to act in this matter without first of all interviewing Father Widera and satisfying yourself that charity will not add to existing personnel problems. If the man could be assigned on a temporary basis or if he could be given some part-time work that would give him the support of living in residence with other priests, half of the problem would be licked. This must be left to the Bishop's discretion and this discretion should not be exercised until pertinent and important questions have been answered. I hope this can be accomplished in a personal interview sometime in January.

There is no thought of incardination involved, and I am quite willing to accept the man back into the Archdiocese whenever circumstances would indicate. Though I anticipate no recurrence of this past aberration, I would certainly want to be informed if the slightest suspicion were to develop. I would like to show fraternal charity to a fellow priest but I cannot be virtuous at the expense of a fellow Bishop.

Reverend Siegfried Widera has served within the Diocese of Orange in California since January 12, 1977. Father Widera came to the Diocese for medical reasons and His Excellency, The Most Reverend William E. Cousins, former Archbishop of Milwaukee, wrote His Excellency, The Most Reverend William R. Johnson, Bishop of Orange, regarding the possibility of extending the Hospitality of the Diocese of Orange to Father Widera while he was on leave from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

Father Widera has served here since that time in an exemplary fashion. He was first assigned to St. Pius V Parish in Buena Park and was transferred four months later due to the fact that the parish was given over to the Irish Augustinian Fathers. Father Widera was then assigned as Associate Pastor at St. Justin Martyr Parish in Anaheim and served there from April 11, 1977 through July 6, 1981. He proved to be extremely popular with all the people and a very hard worker in the parish. Father Widera also works with the Naim Conference and serves as Spiritual Moderator for all conferences within the Diocese. On July 6, 1981, Father Widera was assigned as Associate Pastor to St. Edward's Parish in Dana Point. This assignment came at this time due to the diocesan policy of rotating Associate Pastors approximately every four years.

Father Widera has requested incardination into the Diocese of Orange. All the priests of the Diocese think very highly of him and those who have worked with him these past five years have recommended his incardination in very high and positive terms. On October 23, 1981, Father Widera's request for incardination was presented to His Excellency and his Board of Consultors. Once again and unanimously a decision was given in favor of incardinating Father Widera into the Diocese of Orange.

Some time ago Father Widera wrote to Reverend Joseph A. Janicki, JCL, Vice-Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee regarding submitting his request for incardination into the Diocese of Orange. At this time, in behalf of His Excellency and the Diocese of Orange, I, too, would like to seek your permission to allow Father Siegfried Widera to be excardinated from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in order that he may be incardinated into the Diocese of Orange. 

Dear Father:

We hope that you will give the enclosed financial report of the St. Michael's Priest Fund for 1977-78 a few moments of your time. Althomuch smaller than in previous years, we still realized a profit from our investments after expenses.

We never want the dollars and cents to obscure the more important issue of this report, - namely our priests. Since the Fund started in 1901, thousands of our brother-priests have been helped: the Fund will be there when YOU need it.

Upon the suggestion of the Personnel Board and strong recommendation of the Archbishop, the Directors voted to involve the Fund more in the financial end of the psychological rehabilitation of priest-members both at residential treatment centers or an an out-patient basis. With the prior approval of the Archbishop or ombudsman, the St. Michael's Fund will pay up to 80% of the unpaid balance after Blue Cross-Blue Shield has paid their part. The other 20% is the responsibility of the individual priest. Any other benefit follows the familiar B,C,D, classifications already in effect.

Supplementary aid to retired priests has been changed a little. Last fiscal year approximately \$4,800.00 was paid out to some 28 priests. Using the same formula as last year, 50% of the previous year's profit, we have only \$3,168.00 to work with this year. Therefore rather than sending out applications to all the retired priests, we simply ask that they write directly to the Board if they would like to receive the supplement. It will be small, but we never want to be lacking in our concern for those who have served so long and so well.

There is still a significant number of priests who are in arrears with regards their dues. Remember, this makes you ineligible for benefits. However, payments on past dues are recognized by the Board as a sign of good faith and usually prompts a positive response.

The Board members recognize that while times and needs change, our interest must always be the same, helping our brother-priests, - the purpose for which the Fund was established.

SUBJECT: Reverend Siegfried Widera

Reverend and Dear Father Waldbauer:

Thank you for your letter of 8 October 1976 regarding Father Widera. Thank you for stating in advance that you understand the delicate balance between professional confidentiality on the one hand, and the common good of both Father Widera and the people of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee on the other. With this in mind, I would make the following observations:

- I. I, too, am aware of the rumors which relate to an alleged incident said to have occurred at St. Andrew's Parish in Delavan.
- II. Inasmuch as I was given permission by Father Widera to contact Father Donald Weber and inasmuch as Father Weber, in his role as ombudsman, operates in the external form, it would seem that, as the mathematicians say, quantities equal to the same quantities are equal to each other. In other words, it would seem to make little difference whether I relay information to you or Father Weber does. This belief is furthered by the fact that Father Widera has given me permission to discuss his future assignments within the Archdiocese with the Personnel Board.
- III. You are correct in assuming that Father left St. Andrew's Parish in Delavan for a much-needed vacation in California. It is again a matter of public record that his probation for a felony similar to the one alleged in Walworth County had but three weeks to expire under the sentence of a circuit court judge in Ozaukee County. In light of the intensity level of the rumors in Delavan, it seemed wise not to have Father Widera physically present in the community to serve as an ongoing stimulus to the local gossipers.

- IV. I had been in touch with Father Widera for the first two or three weeks that he had been in California, but I had not been for the last two or three weeks. I am also not in possession of any address at which he could be reached or telephone number where he could be called. This is because Father always called me collect in his contacts with me. I have no reason to suspect that he will not contact me again; on the other hand, I have no reason to suspect he will. I would guess that, inasmuch as Father is staying with his brother, Father Widera's own father would be able to give you an address or phone number where he could be reached.
- V. I can fully sympathize with the problem facing the Personnel Board. If the allegations against Father were proven to be true, and with a previous history of conviction on a similar charge, Father Widera would be a very difficult priest to place in a parochial position within the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. This would be especially true since he has exhausted the geographic possibilities from the Dan of Fond du Lac to the Beersheba of Delavan. Consequently, it is readily apparent that Father would be a very difficult man to whom to give a parochial assignment.
- VI. I have suggested this much to Father, and it is a fact of life which he readily accepts. Father himself has mentioned the possibility of his staying on the West Coast in a non-sacerdotal occupation, at least for the time being.
- VII. It would be my recommendation to Father Widera that his own mental health not to mention the corporate mental health of the Archdiocese would be better served if he were to choose not to attempt to pursue the active ministry in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in the foreseeable future. This does not rule out such a possibility in years to come, nor does it rule out his attempting to find priestly work under the aegis of another diocese. It simply says that both he and the Diocese would be ill-advised to try to work out any type of assignment at this time which would not immediately be followed by the faithful of either Fond du Lac or Delavan to the new parish, where such information could only be deleterious to both Father and the pursuit of his priestly ministry, and to those people whose care he is charged with.

VIII. The problem with all of this is that I have lost touch with Father Widera. When last we talked, he was generally aware of my thinking, although not in the detail spelled out in this letter to you. While I have tried to walk the tightrope between the fora, I would appreciate your and the Board's treating my letter with the same confidentiality with which I submit it to you.

If there is any further help I can be to you, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Conversation with Fr. Rolland Glass

From Paul Esser

Fr. Glass' comments on Fr. Siegfried Widera:

- 1. He was always in bed or sitting--literally. Not very ambitious.
- 2. He drank a lot. The police brought him home on at least one occasion in an intoxicated state. He would leave the bottles laying around his room.

He was a "loner." He had difficulty relating with adults. He had instant rapport with young boys and spent a lot of time with them.

- 4. His family seemd normal.. His father was a very strict German. His three borthers and sisters lost their German accent. Fr. Siegfried did not.
- 5. He would do what he was directed to do, but no more. Would not really move in and take over with a job. He needs a programmed situation—possibly in education.
- 6. He did not take care of his person. He smelled.
- 7. A male grade school teacher saw Fr. Diegfried fooling around with the boys of another teacher. He said to father that if he fooled around in the same way with his students, he would punch Father in the face.
- 8. Fr. Glass had reports for some time from within and without the parish that something was wrong.
- 9. He coached the boys in basketball. He would be in the shower with the boys--all in the mude. When an adult male entered the shower, Fr. Siegfried covered himself with a towel
- 10. Fr. Siegfried took boys swimming at a motel in Milwaukee. Father knew the owner and could use the pool. This happened over a period of time.
- ll. Parishioners came forward after the fact and indicated incidents they had noticed and warnings they had given their own children about not letting Father touch them.
- Fr. Glass' mother told Glass that Fr. Siegfried on at least one occasion had a boy is sleep with him overnight in the rectory.
- 13. Fr. Glass did confront Fr. Siegfried: "Circumstances are forcing me to draw certain conclusions about you and your conduct with little boys." Fr. Siegfried stopped seeing boys for a time but then went back to it.
- 14. There was a pattern of contact with small bosy.
- 15. At the trial, the D.A.' office asked for the full five years in jail. The D.A. is a "good Catholic."







Wisconsin CIB records revealed that Father WIDERA was charged with a crime of sexual perversion involving a ear-old boy in 1973 (Ozaukee County, Wisconsin). The Ozaukee County District Attorney's file contained a police report in which WIDERA confessed to molesting boys in Milwaukee County as well. He was convicted of the charge issued in Ozaukee County and was sentenced to three years probation. WIDERA was transferred to a parish in Delevan WI and later, to the Roman Catholic Diocese of Orange, California to serve as a Priest at a parish in Anaheim, California. WIDERA has faced at least six allegations of sexual abuse in Orange County since 1976. The Diocese of Orange stripped WIDERA of his priestly duties in 1985 and sent him to a treatment program in New Mexico. Siegfried WIDERA's FBI record lists an arrest on 12-20-1989 for Child Molestation/ Child Fondling in Tucson AZ. Additional reports regarding new allegations were filed with Anaheim (CA) PD on April 6, 2002 as well as with other jurisdictions near Anaheim.

WIDERA's DIOCESE OF ORANGE assignment history, Social Security Administration records from 1976-2000, Arizona Corporation records, Arizona Department of Motor Vehicle Records, Pima County Property Ownership records and other reliable records support the fact that WIDERA has not publicly established residency in the State of Wisconsin since he left in June 1976 (WI State Statute 939.74 sub 3). As WIDERA moved from Wisconsin to California in 1976, the six-year statute of limitations for charging the crimes that occurred in Wisconsin has not expired. ADA Chris Liegel of the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office reviewed this case on May 1, 2002 and again on May 20, 2002 for charges.

On 05-22-2002, ADA Liegel issued 4 counts of Enticing a Child for Immoral Purposes and 5 counts of Indecent Behavior with a Child against Siegfried WIDERA. These charges were from statutes that existed from 1969-1975. Each charge is a felony with a 10-year prison penalty. Judge Donald signed a felony warrant for WIDERA authorizing extradition from anywhere in the United States. WIDERA was booked on WAPD sheet for these charges. Additional victims contacted the West Allis Police Department to report other incidents of abuse by WIDERA. These incidents, while documented, were not charged by the respective jurisdictions.

Multiple UFAP (Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution charge, a violation of Federal Code) requests were made through the US Attorney's Office-Eastern District of Wisconsin. All UFAP requests were rejected. The US Marshals Service Southeast Wisconsin Fugitive Task Force pursued leads on WIDERA's whereabouts and extended the search worldwide.

US Marshals Service received a tip that WIDERA had been in Juarez, Mexico. Additional information was aired on Mexican television regarding WIDERA's wanted status. On Sunday, May 25th 2003, WIDERA was located in the Mexico at the VISTA DORADA HOTEL in the city of Mazatlan by Mexican police. WIDERA left two signed notes in his room before he jumped off his third floor balcony. WIDERA died as a result of the injuries sustained from his jump.



This case was closed on 06-08-2003, as the offender is deceased.

INITIAL COMPLAINT: 04-24-2002
On 04-24-2002, came into the West Allis Police Department to report that a Roman Catholic Priest had sexually assaulted him. Some of the assaults occurred in the City of West Allis while was a child. A voice page was sent throughout the station for any detective in the building to call the front desk. I responded to the page and subsequently took complaint.
INFORMATION ABOUT THE VICTIM/ COMPLAINANT,
was soft spoken and had tears in his eyes when I met him. The abuse he detailed appeared emotionally painful for him. expression, voice and tears indicated the depth of this pain caused by this sexual abuse. Though I have handled sexual assaults before, none of the victims I have interviewed appeared so visibly devastated as appeared. In my experience, I have only seen this amount of pain and sadness on the faces, as well as in the voices and tears of parents when I've had to notify them that their child was dead.
abuse with his wife and to the police department. I asked him why he chose to report the abuse now. Told me that emotionally he couldn't really even talk about the abuse before this. Saw an article about Father WIDERA recently in the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Online (www.jsonline.com). Seeing this article dredged up the past. The realized that even if he made a report, there might be little chance of criminal prosecution and that current Wisconsin case law makes it virtually impossible to successfully sue the Church for abuse. Told me that he did not care about that; he just wanted to report, to finally tell someone about the abuse that he and suffered at the hands of Father Siegfried WIDERA.
BACKGROUND AS TO HOW MET THE FATHER WIDERA
(West Allis, WI) with her children. told me that he and his siblings went to school and attended mass at ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS CHURCH, located near 61 st & Madison (West Allis, WI).
Father Siegfried WIDERA, one of the parish priests (a Pastor or an Associate at that time) assigned to ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS CHURCH, came over to the house to visit with and her children shortly after she joined the parish and enrolled them at the parish



school. This first visit would have occurred in the fall of 1969. It was their impression at the time that Father WIDERA visited with all new parishioners. They found out this was not so. Father WIDERA continued to show a special interest in their family. added, "He went out of his way. Even my mother thought this (WIDERA's continued visits and interest in the family) was odd." However, Father WIDERA continued to visit and became familiar with the family. told me that Father WIDERA seemed to pay particular attention to broken homes. remarked, "He (WIDERA) played on the void that was there-being the missing father. He played this to my mother as well. He (WIDERA) gained my mom's trust enough to take me and on day trips. Those trips eventually turned into weekend trips." In the summer their mother allowed them to go camping or go vacationing with Father WIDERA for a week as well. The final trip took with Father WIDERA was when was wears old. The said, "I had just gotten my 'temps' (temporary driver's license) and Father was going to drive to his new assignment in California. We left West Allis, Wisconsin around June 15th, 1976 and I was with him until the last week of August or the first week of September 1976. I asked the had regular contact with Father WIDERA other than during his visits to house during the time that WIDERA was assigned to ST MARY. said he did and explained, "Once we started going to school, it was a normal part of the school day to have a morning mass. I became an altar boy. After mass, Father (WIDERA) would take us (the altar boys) out for breakfast. We would go to a little place on National Avenue- I don't remember the name (of the restaurant). He (WIDERA) seemed very personable. He was also very 'hands on." HOW SEXUAL CONTACT WAS INITIATED: NO FORCE OR THREATS MADE TO I asked what he meant by that. Teplied, "Like tickling us-that kind of thing. He wouldn't just do it momentarily. He would do it for about 5-10 minutes. When he did this (to me) in front of my mom, she even told him to stop because he would do it for so long." I asked how Father WIDERA would tickle him. The would pick me up and tickle my arms and sides. He used his fingers (to tickle). I think this is how he (WIDERA) 'tested the waters' because it (the touching) progressed from there." I asked in what way WIDERA's touching progressed from the tickling. told me that Father WIDERA initiated all the sexual contacts they had. Every sexual contact started with Father WIDERA told me, "I got to hate it when he would tickle me because I knew what was going to happen next." went on to say, "I would make excuses like I was sick when I knew things were going in the direction where he (WIDERA) wanted sexual activity. He always initiated sex by tickling." I asked what he thought about Father WIDERA's relationship with him at the time the abuse was occurring. replied, "When I was younger, I didn't understand it and I didn't know what to think.

As I got older and the contact continued, I was really uncomfortable with it but I didn't want to lose the benefits of the relationship. He took me on trips and did fun activities with me that without him; I would not have been able to do. He also would buy me presents for my birthday and Christmas, like beer steins

and stuffed animals. I still have one of the stuffed animals he gave me."

told me that that the very first time Father WIDERA touched him in a sexual manner was after an early morning mass. told me that at that time, ST MARY had a daily 6:30 am mass, followed by a daily 8:00 am school mass. All the altar boys liked to do the 6:30 am mass because Father WIDERA would keep it short- 20 minutes to ½ hour. Mass always ended before 7:00 am. Father WIDERA would usually take the altar boy(s) out for breakfast during that free hour before the school mass (7:00 am- 8:00 am). described the selection for serving as an altar boy at the early mass as being very competitive, "because everybody liked the breakfasts." Father WIDERA would also take the over to the Rectory after mass and later, to his (WIDERA's) bedroom as well.

described the Rectory as a big building. The Pastor was very old, hard of hearing and would usually sleep in; Father WIDERA would usually take the early masses. The only other person in the Rectory at the time Father WIDERA had ver would have been the elderly female housekeeper. Father WIDERA was able to sneak into the Rectory and into his bedroom without the Pastor or the housekeeper seeing them.

The first sexual contact took place in early 1970. Established believes it was still winter outside, shortly after he was enrolled in the parish school. I showed him a 1969 calendar I had found on the Internet and printed ("Choose a Calendar by Year"). Is looked at the calendar and told me that he believes that this first assault occurred sometime between January 2, 1970 and late March 1970. was eyears old or had just turned at the time of this incident.

Father WIDERA took over to the Rectory after early mass. described the incident to me. He said, "(WIDERA) made it out to be like it was a mistake- that things got out of hand. He tickled me and then reached down and fondled me clarified this to be his genitals) through my clothing. The only thing he said to me when he did that was 'Whoopsey!' I'll never forget that! He said it in a joking manner, 'Whoopsey!' (WIDERA) apologized to me after he did that. It was like he was looking for my input-how I would take it. There was not much of a response from me so he tried to smooth things over. It was like he was trying to see to what extent he could go." As toured the Rectory and the church on 05-14-2002, remembered that this first incident of sexual assault actually took place inside the church Sacristy, not the Rectory.

Father WIDERA continued to take to the Rectory and later, to his bedroom after early mass. WIDERA would fondle genitals and buttocks, sometimes while was clothed and later, while


told us that he had not been inside any of these buildings since he was in 8th grade. We entered the Rectory from the front entrance on S 61st St. There was one staircase immediately to the right of the front entrance. The first floor of the Rectory had long hallway leading straight to the rear of the building. From this hallway, one could access the dining room, the living room, and the kitchen. There was also a bathroom and what appeared to be an office on the first floor as well. We walked down the hallway to the rear of the Rectory.

pointed out where everything was and appeared very familiar with the building. He looked into the kitchen and said the basic layout was much the same as it had been when Father WIDERA was there.




told us that Father WIDERA would normally bring him and later, him and back to his bedroom in the Rectory after early morning mass. Father WIDERA would sometimes make breakfast for them in the kitchen, which is still located in the rear of the Rectory. Father WIEDRA would have use the staircase in the rear (east side) of the Rectory when they went to his bedroom so the housekeeper would not hear or see them. We walked up the stairs to the second floor of the Rectory. The second floor was laid out much like the first floor: one long hallway down the center from which rooms could be accessed. We walked into the bedroom. There was one twin bed against the east wall of that room and a dresser against the west wall. The window in that room faced north. There was a closet with sliding doors on the south wall of the room, located next to the adjacent bathroom. ADA Liegel asked this bedroom still looked the same. Thought it did except the bed, which had been against the opposite wall (west wall) when Father WIDERA was there. 



Father WIDERA attended that game and went to the boy's locker room after it. There were other boys in the room at first. WIDERA told that he needed to wait around because he wanted to talk to wait around because he
was sitting on the bench inside the locker room, looking down and tying his shoes, when he both saw and felt Father WIDERA walk up to him. Tooked up. Father WIDERA rubbed his clothed groin area across face. Told me that he didn't remember exactly what Father WIDERA had said to him, but the remembered that Father WIDERA wanted to perform oral sex on him. Was angry. 














The two rooms that affected the most were the sauna, located off the long hallway to the pool, and the pool area itself. Leves were teary and he had a hard time speaking when we looked in the sauna. He told me that Father WIDERA had fondled genitals inside this same sauna. Told me he would never forget that room, as he had never seen a sauna before that incident. The thought this first incident in the sauna occurred the first year he had returned to ST MARY parish school, (when he was syears old).
The pool is in a very large, open room that is two stories high. The pool and the spa are on the lower level. There is an open staircase leading from the second level balcony that surrounds the pool down to the pool area. The entrance from the long hall to the pool, as well as the pool shower area, was located on the far wall opposite the staircases. This is the pool in which Father WIDERA would swim naked with the boys.
INCIDENTS OF ABUSE AT WIDERA'S PARENTS' HOUSE IN SOUTH MILWAUKEE: 410 HAWTHORNE ST (January 1970- June 1972)
While viewing locations, recalled that WIDERA would also take him to his (WIDERA's) parents' house in South Milwaukee. WIDERA would take along as well and they would go to feed and take care of WIDERA's German Shepard. The remembers that WIDERA sexually molested him in his parents' living room. This was the only room in the house that WIDERA molested in does not remember how many times this happened but did recall that they only went to WIDERA'S parents' house while WIDERA was assigned to ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS; after WIDERA left, they did not go to his parents' house anymore.
OTHER LOCATIONS WHERE SEXUAL CONTACT TOOK PLACE WITH, (1970-1976)
WIDERA was transferred to the parish in Port Washington. added, "It may have just seemed that way though because of all the contact we had before." estimated that after he left ST MARY HELI OF CHRISTIANS in June 1972, Father WIDERA had minimal contact with for 1-2 months. said that Father WIDERA was back in his life again, having sexual relations again, around Christmas 1972.
I asked where else they had sexual contact in Milwaukee County other than the locations already named told me that Father WIDERA had a VW (Volkswagen) bus with drapes on the windows. Father WIDERA would have sexual contact with in that parked bus from 1970 through 1975 or 1976. (Father WIDERA got rid of the bus and purchased a red, 1976 Ford Granada.)
also told me that Father WIDERA would have sexual contact with him on (WIDERA's) 14' fiberglass fishing boat. The boat had an outboard motor on it. told me that sex on that boat occurred up north though (unknown County in Northern Wisconsin).







Ms. Cusac indicated that their records showed that Widera was arrested and prosecuted in Port Washington, Ozaukee County and was placed on probation for three years. Their records indicated that the District Attorney had asked for a 5-year prison sentence. I contacted the Ozaukee County Clerk of Courts and they are faxing information about that case to me.

Ms. Cusac also told me that in August of 1976 there was some type of allegation in Delavan concerning inappropriate contact with children but she had no further information about this. I contacted the Delavan Police Department and the officer I talked to his Captain. This Captain has been a member of that Parish for a long time and he remembered it was a rumor that was not reported to the police. He will check with his Captain to see if he remembers which families might have been involved.



On 04-30-3002, I received a voice mail message from Agent Chris GIJEWSKI (phonetic spelling, ph# 414-382-7832). She said that she located WIDERA's case records and found that the Prosecutor had recommended a prison term of 5 years. The prison term was stayed and WIDERA was placed on 3 years probation. The terms of his probation included No Contact with children in Ozaukee County, psychological therapy as well as continued professional counseling. GIJEWSKI said she did not understand a notation in the file as it indicates that WIDERA was arrested three times after he was convicted in Port Washington. The notes indicated that South Milwaukee PD, Elkhorn PD and Delavan PD also arrested WIDERA, yet none of those arrests appear on his criminal record and it is unclear in what way(s) this affected his probation. I left a message for GIJEWSKI and asked her to fax me copies of records in WIDERA's file.

I checked with those police departments and found none of them had any existing records for the contacts with WIDERA indicated on his probation records. I also checked with St Francis PD as WIDERA had lived there as well when he was younger. St Francis PD did not have any records still in existence from the time period that WIDERA had lived there.

WIDERA'S HOME ADDRESS FROM ARIZONA DMV RECORDS: WIDERA'S RESIDENCY

According to Arizona DMV records, Siegfried WIDERA's address (updated 03-25-2002) is Green Valley, AZ. His current physicals are 510, 250#, BLN/ BLU.



I called Directory Assistance and found that Siegfried WIDERA's home phone number is unlisted/unpublished. I called the Green Valley PD and was told that the Pima County Sheriff's Department, not Green Valley PD, policed WIDERA's address. I called the Pima County Sheriff's Department and spoke with Auxiliary Paul KLINE (#4315). I him if PCSO had a current phone number for Siegfried WIDERA.

The last two properties are recorded with Siegfried WIDERA as the listed owner. Property parcel is a mobile home located at Tucson AZ 85746. The sale/ purchase was recorded in December 1987. According to 2003 tax year information, the property is listed as owner occupied. Property parcel is a single-family home located in Green Valley Country Club Estates at Green Valley AZ 85614. The purchase was recorded on 08-18-1994 and according to 2003 tax year records, it is also listed as owner occupied. I could not locate any other parcels or real estate recorded in WIDERA's in any other state; it appears that his property ownership and real residency is in the State of Arizona. Furthermore, this information indicates that Siegfried WIDERA has been a resident of the State of Arizona from 1987 to present.

RAC checked Siegfried WIDERA's SSA records from 1976-2000. (Records have not been updated for 2001 as of yet.) The SSA records seem to indicate (by employer and employer location) that Siegfried WIDERA has not resided in Wisconsin since he left in 1976.

SSA records list WIDERA as being "self-employed" from 1976-1983. (DIOCESE OF ORANGE records record and support that he was assigned to parishes located in the State of California during that time period.) In 1984 and 1985 the names of the parishes WIDERA was assigned to show up under employer. These parishes are also located in the State of California. 1986 lists WIDERA as being self-employed. (DIOCESE OF ORANGE records show WIDERA was in treatment center in New Mexico until April 1986.) 1987-1990 lists TUCSON CONTAINER CORP as his employer.

In 1991, his employer is listed as CALIFORNIA BOX XOMPANY (13901 S Carmenita Rd, Santa Fe Springs, CA 90670). 1992-2000 entries list TUCSON CONTAINER CORP as his employer.

These SSA records, corroborated with DIOCESE OF ORANGE records, reflect that WIDERA was employed in the State of California and the State of Arizona from 1987-present and therefore, did not have or maintain real residency in the State of Wisconsin.



SIEGFRIED WIDERA'S NAME LISTED IN TUCSON CONTAINER CORP'S VOICE MAIL

I did a reverse search on TUCSON CONTAINER CORP's business address, "6601 S Palo Verde Rd, Tucson AZ" and found that there are three businesses operating out of that address: TUCSON CONTAINER CORP (ph# 520-746-3171), KINO FOAM and KINO PACKAGING CO (ph#520-746-3172). According to business records in Arizona, TUCSON CONATINER CORP is the owner of KINO FOAM and KINO PACKAGING CO.

On 05-12-2002, I called both numbers listed for that address/ those businesses. Siegfried WIDERA's name is listed in the voice mail directory for all three businesses/ corporations. I called those numbers again on 05-24-2002 and found that Siegfried WIDERA's name had been removed from the voice mail directory.



CONTACT WITH ANAHEIM (CA) POLICE DEPARTMENT: OPEN CASE

I queried the name "Siegfried WIDERA" in an Internet search engine and found a news article that appeared in The Sacramento Bee. The news article that appeared on 04-11-2002 detailed an abuse complaint filed with the Anaheim, CA Police Department. I looked that department up on the Internet and found a contact phone number for SGT Chris KIELSCH (ph# 714-765-1958/ fax# 714-765-1549).

I received a copy of this report on 04-25-2002- a day after I had interviewed our complainant/victim,
Anaheim's report details that Father WIDERA tickling the child victim initiated the sexual contact with that victim. According to their report, Father WIDERA proceeded to stick his hand down the front of the victim's pants and underwear. Father WIDERA grabbed, tickled and squeezed the year-old victim's genitals. This is consistent with the statement. Anaheim's victim was molested after Father WIDERA conducted the funeral mass for the transfer of the assault occurred in the victim's home after

DET Lisa Hunter later told me that the Orange County Sheriff's Department also has an open case against WIDERA that they are investigating.

CONTACT WITH THE BREA (CA) POLICE DEPARTMENT: OPEN CASE

of the Diocese of Orange told me that she gave my name and phone number to DET Kortney DODD of the City of Brea (CA) Police Department as they also were investigating a sexual abuse complaint against Father WIDERA; case # Lipsche With DET Kortney DODD on 04-30-2002.

DET DODD asked me for details about the West Allis case and they were provided to her. DET DODD faxed me a copy of their report. Like case, the case, the case details that Father WIDERA established contact with the mother of the victims (two brothers) after she was divorced. He would swim with the victims. He would show up at dinnertime and stay to tuck the boys into their beds. One night one of the victims disclosed to his mother that Father WIDERA had been touching his penis and buttocks when Father WIDERA tucked them into bed. The mother spoke with her other son and that son confirmed that Father WIDERA had been sexually assaulting him in the same manner. The victim brothers in the Brea incident were ages and reveals old at the time the assaults occurred.

REVIEW: OZAUKEE COUNTY DA FILE FROM WIDERA'S 1973 CONVICTION

ADA Chris Liegel obtained the Ozaukee County DA file from WIDERA's 1973 arrest/conviction. The file contained the copies of the victims' and witnesses' statements, as well as copies of the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Department report and the Port Washington PD report.

OZSO DET Robert HACKBARTH, OZSO SGT Eugene TROMBLEY and Port Washington PD officer Allan KLOPP obtained a verbal confession from WIDERA regarding abuse incidents in Ozaukee and Milwaukee counties. The report states, "After talking to Father WIDERA for a considerable length of time he did admit that he had played with a number of boys privates and that he had allowed at least two or three boys to commit an act of sodomy on him. He states that this was to help them in their curiosity about sex. These acts of sodomy were committed in Ozaukee County on STH 84, on STH 57 and possibly on CTH K. The acts of playing with the boys privates occurred in these same areas and also in the City of Port Washington and Sheboygan County as well as Milwaukee County."

INTERVIEW: ALLAN KLOPP (WITNESS/ RETIRED OFFICER- WIDERA'S 1973 CONFESSION)

On 05-20-2002, I made contact with Allan KLOPP. He confirmed that he had been employed by the Port Washington Police Department and was now retired. I explained the reason I was calling and asked him what he remembered about that 1973 confession made by WIDERA.

Allan told me, "He (WIDERA) was drinking the boys urine! He would pull off on the side of the road and have the boys get out of the vehicle. He would have the boys drop their pants and urinate into his mouth! That's what I remember! I had to leave the interview 2 or 3 times because I wanted to punch his so badly! He honestly believed that this touching and molestation and urination crap caused no harm to the boys! I would lay it out for him, explain it to him. He looked me in the eyes and basically told me it was no big deal. For him this stuff was like saying, 'I breathe air' or 'I eat food.' He felt that these acts of molesting young boys were normal and natural."



Allan told me that he tried to find out what happened with WIDERA's case. The only answer he received from the Ozaukee County DA's office (in the 1970's) was that it was turned over to the Church to handle.

INTERVIEW: EUGENE TROMBLEY (WITNESS/ RETIRED SERGEANT; DOCUMENTED WIDERA'S 1973 CONFESSION)

I spoke with Eugene TROMBLEY regarding Siegfried WIDERA. Eugene TROMBLEY was unable to recall any events by WIDERA'S name alone. He told me that he would need to see the reports or his memo book to jog his memory. I will attempt to interview him, in-person, at a later date.

INTERVIEW: ROBERT HACKBARTH (WITNESS/ RETIRED DETECTIVE THAT OBTAINED WIDERA'S 1973 CONFESSION)

On 06-05-2002, I went to Robert HACKBARTH's home and interviewed him regarding the 1973 incident. Prior to showing him the reports, Robert recalled the arrest clearly and told me that the head priest at St Mary's in Port Washington and some of the parishioners tried to have Robert and the other officers that worked on the WIDERA case fired from their jobs. Robert said the parents of some of the boys and the head priest made life as uncomfortable as they could for the law enforcement officers involved. Robert commented that the same still won't talk to him when they see each other.

Robert told me, a victim's) father went to the church. He was very angry with us for questioning his son. He accused us of picking on this Priest and his son. He complained that we were 'dealing out of hand'- not giving people their rights. That of course was all boloney. The head priest at St Mary's must have spoken with the DA, James LaPointe about it. The Sheriff at that time, Artie Helm, told me that these people were disgusted with our investigation and wanted us fired. Our Sheriff supported us though."

I asked how the incident was discovered. Robert told me that Port Washington PD Sergeant Sellmeier saw WIDERA's VW van weaving on the highway and thought he had a drunk driver. SGT Sellmeier pulled the van over and when he made contact with the occupants, Sellmeier noticed that WIDERA's and another boy's pants were down. SGT Sellmeier asked them what was going on. Robert said, "I was called in to work because he (SGT Sellmeier) thought there was an act of sexual perversion going on."

I asked what WIDERA's demeanor was during the interview. Robert said that it was like, "I'll tell you what you want to know and let's get this over with." Robert noted that WIDERA acted sorrowful for what he had done. On the same token, WIDERA's victims had said that, "Father (WIDERA) always said that God permits this (acts of sexual abuse/ perversion). This is part of growing up and being in the Christian life."



WIDERA admitted during the interview that he had one of the boys urinate into his (WIDERA's) mouth and WIDERA drank the boy's urine. WIDERA also admitted that this abusing was one of the problems in his life and said that he had these same problems before. Robert told me that was when they (OZSO) found out about WIDERA's history at ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS in West Allis.

Robert told me that the victims said that there was never any drugs or alcohol involved when these incidents occurred that Father WIDERA did these things because he (WIDERA) wanted to do them.

I asked Robert why, when so many acts and contacts were admitted to, why WIDERA was only charged with one count of sexual perversion. Richard explained, "The Church hired a defense attorney (Attorney Charles F POLIDORI; 1973 address of 2922 W Forest Home Av; ph# 672-0100) for WIDERA." Robert supposed that the lone charge was due to an arrangement between the DA at that time (La Pointe) and WIDERA's defense attorney.

The ADA that handled the case was Joseph MCCORMACK. ADA MCCORMACK recommended prison but the head priest at St Mary's wanted WIDERA to just get probation- no prison. The Judge went with what the Church wanted. Robert told me that ADA MCCORMACK was really upset about this case. Robert told me that former ADA MCCORMACK is now the Judge for Branch 1 in Ozaukee County.

Robert asked where his report was that he had written. I replied that the contents in the file were everything we received. Robert told me that his report was not in the file and should have been. He also wondered where WIDERA's pre-sentence investigation report was as that report might be helpful. Robert said that he would check his daybooks and see if he could find more information about that investigation.



told me that she is not sure what, if anything, WIDERA taught at the school. She did recall he always seemed to be around in the lunchroom, in the gymnasium and on the playground. said



that the Pastor, Father LAST, was very old at that time. WIDERA was much younger and would always be on the playground, playing with the children. told me that WIDERA would walk up to her while she was waiting in line for lunch. He would get in front of her and pinch her breasts. described WIDERA's manner as being "sneaky" as he would position himself in a way where it would be difficult for anyone to really see what he was doing. said he did this to other girls as well but she did not recall their names. I did not know how many times WIDERA did this to her as it happened so often. saw WIDERA hug the schoolboys and grab their "behinds" (buttocks) while on the playground and in the lunchroom. Father WIDERA especially liked the boys. witnessed WIDERA pull the legs of the boys' shorts up in gym class, exposing the boys' thigh area up to their groin. said that WIDERA would call individual altar boys out of class on a weekly basis on the pretense that they had to prepare for a funeral the next day. The rest of the class was envious of the altar boys, as they wanted to get out of class on a frequent basis too. The told me that, "He (WIDERA) went for the shy, heavy set boys, not the athletic types...the type that sat on the side and watched everyone else. The ones that were altar boys." said that WIDERA would go on outings and/ or call the following altar boys out of class a lot: INCIDENT WHERE WIDERA EXPOSED HIMSELF TO CCURRED ON THE SCHOOL GROUNDS IN THE TUNNEL BETWEEN THE CONVENT AND THE SCHOOL told me that there was a tunnel that went from the Convent to the school. told us that WIDERA returned to Wisconsin in 1986 for the purpose of assisting with officiating her son's wedding ceremony at ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS. I asked where WIDERA was living at the time of her son's wedding. Teplied that WIDERA was living in Tucson, Arizona.
said that WIDERA had confided in her that he never wanted to be a Priest but his mother wanted one of her sons to enter the Priesthood. Said that WIDERA became a Priest to please his mother. He drank a lot of alcohol and had a voracious appetite when it came to food. When WIDERA visited in 1986, he told that he was having problems and needed prayers. He asked not to say anything to anyone about that.
I asked the if she knew the true reason WIDERA left ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTAINS parish in 1972. Thought it was just normal rotation as he had been there for 3 or 4 years. Told us that WIDERA did not get along at all with Father SETNICAR (now deceased). A admitted that one of her friends has a son who is now a police officer. Back then, that son told his mother that Father WIDERA had tried to pull his swim trunks down in the pool. The boy added that he managed to get away before WIDERA did anything to him. I did not understand why her friend did not do anything about what her son had told her then- why her friend didn't call the police. (The had spoken with this friend after the WIDERA charges were on TV on 05-24-2002.)
I asked where WIDERA would stay when he visited in Wisconsin. It told me that WIDERA usually would stay with his sister, while he was here visiting but would also stay with his brother, especially after moved to Arizona. WIDERA would usually rent a vehicle or would use one of cars while he was here visiting.
I asked about WIDERA's family. Still lives in Brookfield WI. Smoother moved to Tucson in 2000 and WIDERA's brother, so lives in California. I asked if she knew where WIDERA's father and mother are buried. I husband, retrieved a funeral card they received at funeral. The funeral was

CONTAINER CORP until now operates a company that competes with TUCSON CONTAINER CORP for business. had given him the job of training Siegfried WIDERA after Siegfried told me that "was 'let go' or 'booted out' of the treatment center in Albuquerque NM" in 1987. Siegfried as "kind of slow- not quick on the job." Further described Siegfried WIDERA as "an alcoholic" and told me that WIDERA was into prescription drugs. recalled that WIDERA was living in a trailer in a rough part of Tucson called Drexel Heights. saw a box in that trailer. The box was filled with prescription drugs in other people's names. commented, "Like Mabel and other names that were obviously not his!" WIDERA told that, "his friends in Orange County also noticed a box filled with new but cheap stuffed animals, gave the medications to him." "like the kind you get in that machine game with the 'claw." asked WIDERA why he had a box of stuffed animals in the trailer. WIDERA replied that he liked to give them out. made Siegfried move out of the trailer and get a place in Green Valley AZ. Said that the WIDERA family has always covered for Siegfried in the past and he does not believe that will change now. The WIDERAs have family in Germany. They also own a cottage in Big Bear/ Moon Lake CA. When was still involved with the business, Siegfried had liked to travel to destinations in California.
described WIDERA's manner of speaking as "being like a woman. He would say things like 'Oh my heavens!' or 'Oh dear!'" remembered an incident where he and Siegfried took a client out to dinner. Siegfried drank a lot of wine. A pretty woman walked past and the client and made comments about her body. Siegfried's comment to the group about the woman was that, "she has the butt of a 13 year old boy." The client and looked at each other and dismissed Siegfried's comment as being the result of his drunken state. It recalled that Tucson PD had arrested Siegfried WIDERA in 1989 for molesting a child. He did not remember the details of the case- only that the case was dismissed. It said that after that arrest and the news now, Siegfried's comment during dinner took on a whole new meaning.
WIDERA, had funneled money to Siegfried. described Siegfried WIDERA as, "Cheap! Cheap! Cheap! Refuses to spend money but will gladly eat at other's expense!" would see Siegfried driving different fancy cars and asked about it. CONTACT WITH THE US DEPARTMENT OF STATE (WIDERA'S PASSPORT STATUS)

On 05-24-2002, The US Department of State sent a written reply as well as a copy of WIDERA'S latest
application for a passport. WIDERA's latest passport, was issued on June 23, 2000.

WIDERA's appearance in the passport photo is consistent with his appearance in the photo forwarded by
he Pima County Sheriff's Department.

According to the letter of explanation, US Department of State passport records do not include any records of travel as those stamps/ visas are obtained after the passport is issued.

CONTACT WITH THE US DEPARTMENT OF STATE (PLACED "LOOKOUT" IN TECS)

On 06-05-2002, I called and spoke with SSA Brad MARKWALD, US Department of State- Chicago Office (ph# 312-353-6163) and explained this situation to him. He looked up WIDERA's passport by the number I gave him and confirmed information. He agreed to place a "lookout" status on WIDERA's passport number in TECS (Treasury Enforcement Computer System). SSA MARKWALD explained that this is the system that US Customs and US Immigration & Naturalization uses; if WIDERA is out of the US and attempts to re-enter, Customs or INS see the "lookout" and would detain him based on the warrant entered in NCIC. He also explained that if WIDERA tried to enter a country like the United Kingdom or Germany, their officials would see the "lookout" status and would refuse him before he could enter the country. When turned away, WIDERA would be placed on the next flight back to the US and the country that refused entry would notify US agents.

SSA MARKWALD said he would also contact Interpol regarding this case, as they may be able to assist in apprehension if WIDERA did flee to another country. I sent information regarding the warrant, as well as WIDERA's personal information to him via email.



CONTACT WITH US MARSHALS SERVICE-EASTERN DISTRICT OF WISCONSIN

On 06-05-2002, I spoke with Deputy Douglas BACHERT of the US Marshals Service-Eastern District of Wisconsin (ph# 414-297-3303). He was appointed to obtain the UFAP (Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution) warrant for WIDERA. I advised him that although WIDERA was transferred from Wisconsin to California in 1976, WIDERA suddenly fled from Arizona, the state where he had been a public resident since 1987, after he found out that law enforcement agencies in the State of California had started criminal investigations into the allegations of sexual abuse (by WIDERA) that occurred there from 1976-1985. A civil suit was also filed by one of the victims in conjunction with one of the open criminal investigations. In addition, the Los Angeles news media descended on WIDERA's home and business to attempt to find him.

Deputy BACHERT will attempt to seek a UFAP warrant for WIDERA on 06-06-2002. A copy of the email I sent to SSA MARKWALD was sent to Deputy BACHERT as well.

UFAP WARRANT DENIED ON 06-07-2002; RE-DRAFTED/ RE-PRESENTED 06-14-2002

On 06-07-2002, Federal Judge Goodstein rejected Deputy Bachert's request for a UFAP charge. AUSA Steve Inghram (ph# 297-1722) re-drafted and re-presented the charge to Judge Goodstein on 06-14-2002. On 06-19-2002, Judge Goodstein rejected this UFAP request again.

CONTACT WITH FBI-MILWAUKEE (CASE/ PORTAL TO VERIZON WIRELESS)

On 06-12-2002, I went to FBI-Milwaukee and spoke with SA Monica Shipley (Acting Supervisor), regarding this case. She consulted with other agents in an attempt to find a way to formally assist with this case or to open a case with FBI. A check with their policies revealed that this case did not fit their criteria under which they could formally assist or open a case.







This call was recorded and Lieutenant Fujinaka provided a copy of the conversation on audiotape. This audiotape was placed on WAPD property #
told me, "I heard from him (Siegfried WIDERA) this morning (06-12-2002)." admitted that she spoke with Siegfried via telephone but claimed she had no idea as to where he is. admitted that Siegfried is aware of the felony charges against him in Wisconsin and the fact there is a warrant for his arrest. On 06-17-2002, ADA Feiss assisted me in drafting a second subpoena directed to FIRST USA BANK, NATIONAL ASSOCIATION for WIDERA's VISA account records from 06-10-2002 through 06-17-2002. This subpoena also specified ongoing monitoring of the location of any transactions that occur in the future until notice is received that such information is no longer needed.

Judy BERRY-STOCK checked the account for activity on 06-18-2002 and 06-19-2002. There has been no activity on this account since that transaction in Portland, Texas on 06-10-2002. She will continue to monitor this account and will call if there is any new activity.

CONTACT: BUCCANEER RESORT HOTEL- MARATHON, FLORIDA (CONFIRMATION AS TO WHICH VEHICLE WIDERA IS DRIVING THROUGH REGISTRATION RECORDS)

WIDERA's VISA credit card records show that he stayed at the Buccaneer Resort Hotel in Marathon, Florida. This expense posted to his VISA account on May 24, 2002. I checked an atlas and found that Marathon, Florida is located in the Florida Keys. I queried "Buccaneer Marathon Florida" in an Internet search engine with negative results. I then queried "Florida Keys" and found a site for hotel and motel lodging in the Florida Keys: www.flkeyslodging.org. The Buccaneer Resort Hotel was listed and I was able to obtain their phone number from that listing (ph# 1-800-843-1799).

I contacted personnel at the Buccaneer Resort and explained the situation. Registration personnel pulled the record that had WIDERA's vehicle information listed on it. The manager I spoke with, "Rick", told me that WIDERA listed his vehicle as a Lincoln, Arizona plate # Rick told me that they take their guest's word as to the vehicle make and plate as hotel personnel do not visually confirm that information.

TTY SENT THROUGH TCSS FOR TEXAS, NEW MEXICO & ARIZONA TO LOOK FOR WIDERA

DET Fabry and I examined WIDERA's VISA expenditures from 04-11-2002 through 06-10-2002. From this, a pattern of travel appeared through the places where the expenditures occurred. From the postings dated 06-03-2002 through 06-10-2002, it appears that WIDERA is traveling west, back towards Tucson Arizona, traveling virtually the same route he took east when he fled Arizona.

As of 06-10-2002 at 4:55 pm, WIDERA was at a gas station located in Portland, Texas. This city is just north of Corpus Christi, Texas, and is southeast of San Antonio, Texas. If WIDERA were heading west toward Tucson, his projected route would be I-37 north to San Antonio and then I-10 west to Tucson. DET Fabry and I also noticed that WIDERA tends to stay at small motels and inexpensive chain hotels.

SGT Ferry sent out an Attempt to Locate through TSCC for all law enforcement agencies located along that route in Texas, New Mexico and Arizona.



WIDERA'S CREDIT CARD ACTIVITY CEASED: 06-10-2002

Deputy Doug Bachert and I continued to check WIDERA's credit card activity but found that WIDERA ceased using the known credit card he had frequently used. This cessation occurred just after the TTY was sent out to all law enforcement agencies along his predicted route. As of 09-01-2002, WIDERA still has not used that credit card and it carries a credit balance in excess of \$500.

VEHICLE WIDERA OWNED TIED TO THE WARRANT/ PROBLEM IN THAT SOME OF THE VEHICLES WERE RETITLED DAYS AFTER WARRANT LINK

The vehicle that WIDERA had used to and from Florida, a 2000 LINC EXC 4DSD, AZ plate# VIN# ILNHM81 W0YY843844, had been tied to the warrant in June 2002. The van WIDERA owned, a 1999 CHEV SV1 VN, AZ plate# VIN# 1GBFG15R5V1053107, was also tied to the warrant in early June as this was the other vehicle his sister mentioned her brother Siegfried might take, depending upon the parking situation in Fort Lauderdale. That way, if an officer ran the plate of VIN# of either vehicle, the warrant for WIDERA would be listed.
DUSM Bachert and I kept monitoring the listed ownership and plate numbers of WIDERA's other vehicles as well: a 2000 CHEV S10 12PU, AZ plate# VIN# 1GCCS1952YK267197, a 2001 CHEV IMP 4DSD, AZ plate# VIN# 2G1WF55K719154589 (Vehicle is listed to him and TUCSON CONTAINER CORP at the company's address) and a VIN#5ASAG2749YF008381.
I ran the plates and VIN#'s for these vehicles on 08-17-2002 and found that the Chevrolet S10 pick up truck, VIN# IGCCS1952YK267197 had been retitled on 07-09-2002. Was now the listed owner of the pick up truck. New plates had also been issued for this vehicle through the State of Arizona: plate #115JKS. As this was the only vehicle that had been retitled and had new plates, we felt this might be the vehicle Siegfried WIDERA might be using. On 08-20-2002, the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department updated WIDERA's warrant with this new plate number. On 10-10-2002 I re-ran this VIN# and found that it had been re-titled again on 08-26-2002just six days after the new plate had been tied to the warrant for WIDERA. This time TUSCON CONTAINER CORP was now the listed owner and new plates had again been assigned through Arizona: This plate was added to WIDERA's warrant on 10-18-2002.
On 08-20-2002, the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department received a \$H (delayed hit) when they entered the plates issued to for this truck: US Customs Service in West Nogales had queried that plate at 5:25 pm on 08-19-2002 as it crossed the border. I contacted US Customs to find out why the vehicle plate had been queried. I found out that the vehicle plate was recorded crossing the border at an unmanned station (a routine practice) and that they had no other information.
In January 2003, DUSM Bachert received a tip that vehicles had been exchanged in El Paso, Texas. Someone had provided a 2000 Buick 4DR, VIN# 2G4WS52J7Y1207665 to Siegfried WIDERA. This vehicle listed to the WEST TEXAS CONTAINER CORP, a company that is owned by Siegfried WIDERA's brother. It had Texas plate and the sieger and the siege



VIN# were added to WIDERA's warrant on 01-27-2003. This was the vehicle found on the lot on the Vista Dorada Hotel lot in Mazatlan, Mexico on 05-25-2003.

The car Siegfried had used to drive to and from Florida still listed to him in Arizona but had, in fact, been re-titled in the State of Texas on 08-15-2002. The vehicle was re-titled with the new listed owner as being WEST TEXAS CONTAINER CORP. It was assigned Texas plate # This plate was also tied to the WIDERA's warrant on 10-18-2002.

VERIZON TELEPHONE RECORDS RETURNED

DUSM Bachert and I received telephone records subpoenaed. The account holder for the phone number Siegfried WIDERA had provided to the travel agent that booked his cruises was an employee of TUSCON CONTAINER CORP named Andrew MONFRED. The phone was obtained through a corporate account. Phone numbers were searched and the US Marshals Service interviewed the listed account holders. The phone records were not of any use in our attempts to locate Siegfried WIDERA.

TAMBITATION THE WAY
I interviewed Father James P VOJTIK, (M/W; ST MARY'S LAKE CHURCH, wia phone on 06-26-2002. I received the following information from Father VOJTIK:
"I arrived in '75 at ST ANDERWS- June or July. He (WIDERA) was already there. At some point the Pastor told me that he (WIDERA) was getting psychiatric help or counseling and that he (WIDERA) 'had trouble with boys.' (WIDERA) was supposed to be monitored while here (at ST ANDREWS). I supposed the Pastor was monitoring him. I didn't know.
I remember going to a Brewers game via bus with him and a group of kids. On the way home, I saw him rolling around on the floor with some of them. He was tickling them (boys) and they were tickling him. I did not think it was appropriate behavior and reported it to the Pastor (Eugene HENKE- now deceased). As far as how others viewed him, (WIDERA) was tremendously well-liked and was adept at most sports. He was indefatigable! Lots of activities and always on the go."
I asked why WIDERA had to leave ST ANDREWS. Father VOJTIK explained:
"I was leaving ST ANDREWS for a new appointment. On the day I was leaving, two ladies, was and and seemed rushed into the Rectory after morning mass. They were very upset and very shaken by what they saw. They had attended morning mass and they witnessed Father WIDERA performing a sex act in the Sacristy with two boys. They came in and told me that they had 'seen him in the act' with a young server and saw him with a young child. The ladies were shaken up and crying.
The procedure back then was you tell the Pastor and the Pastor took care of it. This time I called the Priest Personnel Board or the Chancellery directly to report what had happened. I don't remember which but it was one of them. I left the parish that afternoon and WIDERA left the parish that next day; the Diocese moved him almost immediately! I'm not sure what happened but I think there was something that he could not serve in a priestly capacity in Milwaukee. I don't know if (WIDERA) was confronted. I believe they passed that off on the Pastor. I don't know if I told the Pastor or not. I did tell the Executive of the Priest Board, Father John WELLBAUER (no longer serving as a priest) and I think I also told Father Bob SAMPON."

SUBPOENA TO ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE FOR RECORDS REGARDING SIEGFRIED WIDERA

ADA Liegel had requested WIDERA's records from the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE. On May 13, 2002, the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE voluntarily turned over 56 pages of documents pertaining to Siegfried WIDERA. None of those documents mentioned the 1976 incident reported directly to the Archdiocese by Father VOJTIK. ADA Liegel contacted Matthew FLYNN, the attorney retained by the ACRCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE, to inform him that he (ADA Liegel) believed there were documents that had not been turned over. Attorney Flynn said the Archdiocese would not turn over treatment documentation or other documentation without a subpoena as the information in those documents may be privileged.

On 07-11-2002, ADA Liegel drafted a Subpoena Duces Tecum for any information, including, without exception, all information in the custody and control of the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE whether or not such information may be considered secret or confidential pursuant to Roman Catholic Canon Law. Milwaukee County Judicial Court Commissioner Barry Slagle signed the subpoena and it was delivered to QUARLES & BRADY LLP/ Attorney Matthew FLYNN.



MOTION FOR A PROTECTIVE ORDER TO PREVENT THE RELEASE OF WIDERA'S TREATMENT RECORDS AND OTHER RECORDS

In a letter dated 07-26-2002, Attorney David MUTH (QUARLES & BRADY) provided notice that as counsel for the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE, he had filed a Notice of Motion and Motion for a Protective Order to prevent having to produce certain documents "on the grounds that they are protected from disclosure." The motion was to be heard at a future time and date. It did not occur, as WIDERA was not taken into custody.

DOCUMENTS TURNED OVER UPON SUBPOENA

A packet from QUARLES & BRADY was hand delivered to the West Allis Police Department. The packet contained all the documents the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE was willing to turn over in response to the subpoena. The packet contained to following groups of documents:

- Priest Ombudsman File- marked "Confidential"
- Clergy Personnel/ Personnel Board/ Vicar for Clergy
- Chancery/ Archive files
- St Michael Priest's Fund Archived Files
- Siegfried WIDERA's file from ST FRANCIS SEMINARY
- Project Benjamin Files

The documents provided background information about WIDERA's scholastic and family history, interests and assignments. The documents also reveal in detail the reasons and the efforts that were made by the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE to get WIDERA out of the State of Wisconsin in 1976.

SIEGFRIED WIDERA LOCATED IN MEXICO & JUMPED TO HIS DEATH: 05-25-2003

US Marshals Service received a tip that WIDERA had been in Juarez, Mexico. Additional information was aired on Mexican television regarding WIDERA's wanted status. On Sunday, May 25th 2003, WIDERA was located in the Mexico at the VISTA DORADA HOTEL in the city of Mazatlan by Mexican police. WIDERA left two signed notes in his room before he jumped off his third floor balcony. WIDERA died as a result of the injuries sustained from his jump.

FINAL CASE DISPOSITION

This case was officially closed on 06-08-2003, as the offender, Siegfried WIDERA, is deceased. The file can be released, however, care should be taken to protect the names of the victims.



LAST WILL & TESTAMENT LETTERS LEFT BY WIDERA PRIOR TO HIS JUMP/ APOLOGIZES FOR WHAT HAPPENED IN THE PAST & ASKS FOR FORCIVENESS

Siegfried WIDERA left two notes in his hotel room at the VISTA DORADA HOTEL before he jumped off the third floor balcony to his death. Both are signed and are dated "05-25-2003." In the first note, addressed, "To whom it may concern," Siegfried WIDERA wrote that he was "very sorry for what happened in the past" and asked for God to have mercy on his soul. WIDERA also expressed gratitude to his family. Finally, Siegfried WIDERA asked that if the note is accepted as his "last will and testament", that he wanted "whatever is left" to go to his family, "...Thanking you (his family) for everything."

In the second note, left on MANDALAY BAY (a hotel located in Las Vegas, NV) stationery, Siegfried WIDERA wrote that he wanted to leave everything that he possessed in Mazatlan (Mexico) to and the passport application and corporate filings Siegfried WIDERA completed as well as all of Siegfried WIDERA's handwritten letters and notes turned over by the ARCHDIOCESE OF MILWAUKEE.

SW was ordained for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee 1967. In 1973 while stationed at St. Mary Parish in Port Washington he was arrested for sexual abuse of a minor. He was given three years probation and the judged ordered him to be sent outside the area. He was sent for therapy and then went to St. Andrew Parish in Delavan. He reoffended there but the parents did not want it reported to authorities and wanted him gone. Between November and December of 1976 W announced his intention to move out of the territory of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. The Archdiocese learned that he would go to Florida to visit his parents and then go to California where his brother lived. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee did not send Widera to California on its own initiative.

In December 1976 when the Archdiocese learned that Widera was in California, the Archbishop of Milwaukee, William E. Cousins, notified the Bishop of Orange, William R. Johnson. Archbishop Cousins warned Bishop Johnson that any decision about giving Widera an assignment was at Johnson's discretion. He indicated that this exercise of Johnson's discretion should not occur until "pertinent and important questions have been answered." Cousins further advised that Johnson should have a personal meeting with Widera before making any decisions. Cousins told him that there had been a problem with Widera and young boys. He also said that Widera needed to find a doctor in California to continue in therapy.


In October 1981 Monsignor Michael P. Driscoll, acting for Bishop Johnson, informed the Archdiocese of Milwaukee that Widera was seeking to transfer his incardination from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee to the Diocese of Orange and that Bishop Johnson had approved this request.

The Diocese of Orange removed Widera in 1985 as soon as it became aware that he was suspected of sexually abusing children there. The diocese sent Widera for therapy for one year in New Mexico.

"Today, if such a request were to be made by any archdiocese, the priest would not be admitted to pastoral work in the Diocese of Orange," Bishop Tod Brown said in a prepared statement. "While the acceptance of a priest undergoing treatment was considered acceptable then, it is not today, and we regret any pain that may have been caused by accepting Widera in 1976."

In 2002 a warrant was issued for Widera's arrest. He was finally located in Mexico where he fell / jumped to his death from a hotel balcony.

What was done in 1973 by the courts and by the Church, simply moving an offender elsewhere, does not happen today. What happened in 1976, accepting a priest from another diocese without a thorough background check, does not happen today. There is a form that must be completed by the priest's own bishop verifying that there are no problems in the man's background. (Copy attached)



Hearing the stories of so many others has given me the strength and fortitude to finally do what is not only right but what I believe to be the only way to finally put the bad memories and possibly the nightmares that I have lived with for so long to rest. I write this not to ally the fears of my family or friends, but for myself. To hopefully, once and for all end an incredibly long nightmare that time itself has failed to heal.

The fourth grade. The time in a child's life when girls still had cooties and girl germs were still a threat to any healthy young boy. An innocent time when a kid could still be a kid and growing up was still over lifes' horizon. Unfortunately for me, I had to grow up a lot faster than most nine year olds and in doing so too much got left behind. Never again would there be innocence, but only the guilt that comes with the angst of knowing that I could possibly have stopped a horrible sickness that was being spread by one man. A man who would steal away my life and ,for all I know ,countless others.

The man was Father Sigfried Widera. A person who used his pleasant charm to steal his way into families hearts only to steal away the innocence of their children. It all started with the trips to the swimming pool at Lake Lawn Lodge, and continued at the school and the church itself. The swimming trips all started out innocently at first with other children present. But there were the times when he would pick me up by myself and that's when the abuse would occur. It never seemed odd to me at the time but when I look back I can always remember the time in the afternoon that he would pick me up. I now can see clearly the clock on the wall as it reached 3:00pm and the lady watching the pool area would leave either for the day or for her break. I remember her name was with her slightly hunched over posture and an otherwise kind smile. Afterward, as I looked back over the years I wondered for a long time if she knew what he was doing, but in retrospect I no longer believe she did.

It was at the times she left that I would unwillingly become (for lack of a better word) a tool of masturbation for this man. It would be either in the pool itself or in the shower. He would pull me against him and rub his erection between my legs or on my back until he was sexually gratified. I can remember as he ran his hands over my own genitals and how I tried to push his hands away. I can remember crying and begging him to please let me go but to no avail. And when he was done and after he would let me go I would step away and sometimes look back and see him staring at the ground as if he was praying. And I wondered if he was thanking God for what he had just received or if he might actually be praying for forgiveness. For me there has been no forgiving. Not for him. Not for myself. Not for God.


Other times he would take me out on his boat. He would say we were just going to visit with other parishioners who lived on the lake. But before we could make it to their homes, he would find a deserted location on the lake and the same thing would happen again. Other times he would put me on his lap when we were driving someplace and rub himself on my buttocks. There were times when he would come to my home and while my mom would be in the kitchen making coffee for him, he would pull me on his lap and do the same thing.


This wasn't one of those things that happened once or twice, it was something that occurred many times over many months, and I lived in shame blaming myself to this day for even being in reach of this man.

I can remember finally finding a way to end this abuse. I had thought for weeks that I would finally get up the courage to tell about what was happening to me without exposing myself to any humiliation. I thought I had the perfect solution and it was so simple. This was the year I was to have my first confession. All I would have to do was enter the confessional anonymously and tell my story. I had looked forward to this time for months and for the first time in months that I felt good about myself. As I entered that booth I was determined to end this. It was only to my horror that I entered the confessional and heard that voice that could belong to only one man. I can still to this day feel the devastation that entered me that day and the thought that it was a sign from God to keep my mouth shut. I went home that night and cried. A memory that burns in me to this day.

A sense of relief came only after I found out he was gone. No explanation to the students and none that I can remember hearing about to the adults. At the time I thought it was over but little did I know it was all just beginning.

Not long after he had left I began to feel as if the other kids were treating me different. I had begun to think that maybe they knew what he had been doing to me and they were angry at me for telling on him. I began to distance myself and to become a loner. I withdrew into myself and promised myself that no one would ever get the chance to get close.





In the last six months I have learned that the abuse that I suffered did not have to happen and probably would not have happened if this archdiocese had not shuffled Widera to St. Andrews immediately after he was convicted of child abuse in 1973. I was appalled to find out that he was allowed to be in contact with young children even after a conviction. Was no one warned of this man. After he was removed from St. Andrews, why wasn't something done for the children. Were we so unimportant.

I already know that this man was transferred to another church and he did it again. I live with the thought that I could have stopped this if only I had come forward sooner. And now I know that this man is on the run. This doesn't scare me for my sake but for the safety of some poor child that might have to grow up as I did. I Only wish I believed enough in prayer to pray for any child he comes across. I wonder now where do I go from here.

Dear Father:

I can fully understand the concerns which you outline in your recent note to me. I will try to explain the situations to you.

Father was referred to me by a local psychiatrist to whom he had been sent by his gastroenterologist. Father was suffering from chronic colitis which was seriously interfering with his digestion of food. As a result of this he was undergoing an increasing weight loss; at one time about a year ago he was hospitalized in Trinity Hospital because of the threat of dehydration. The way back for has been slow and painful. The alternative to intensive care I feel sure would have been a severe ulcerative colitis of the type that his classmate Father suffered through when he was critically ill a couple of years ago. At the present time Father's condition is much improved. His visits have been cut (as you will notice on the statements) from twice weekly to once weekly and I can foresee the time when they will be spaced even further.

Father Widera presents a completely different picture. He is, as I am sure you know, on probation for child molestation. It was a stipulation of the sentencing judge that the supervision be strict. It appears as though the judge was unusually harsh and severe in the sentencing. This is especially true since we have tried to have the probation reduced from three years to two but without success.

I am the <u>de facto</u> probation officer. The actual probation officer, who is a member of St. Andrew's Parish in Delavan, has been content to have virtually no contact with Father Widera except written forms which Father must fill out under State statute. In the event that Father Widera should encounter any type of difficulty, real or imagined, his probation can be suspended almost capriciously and he can be remanded—without even so much as a court hearing—to the penitentiary at Waupun. I insist on weekly meetings since the publicity and incarceration would bring incalculable harm to Father and extreme embarassment in the press to the Archbishop and the Diocese.

All of this is in preamble to whether either of the priest patients could personally afford to underwrite part of the therapeutic expenses. Frankly, I do not know. I suspect Father is folks are a slight cut above the average working man in income but Father has been stationed in a large parish where I would suspect there has been an above average amount of revenue for a priest ordained as many years as he.


While Father Widera's folks are probably much wealthier, Father himself appears to have little of the material. I would suspect he has had less income since ordination and also that the legal expenses incurred were great.

Over a period of the last fifteen years it has been my privilege to have had in therapy many priests of the Archdiocese. I have never totalled the amount but I am sure that it has been more than substantial. Priests seem to do better therapeutically with psychologists than they do with psychiatrists. Perhaps this is because we come out of a broad spectrum liberal arts background rather than the more austere premedical training; I suspect it is even more so because psychologists do not want or require the tacit admission of being "sick" that one must give when one enters any physician's office.

The problem has been that psychologists have ordinarily not been able to recover payment from insurance companies as have psychiatrists. At the present time there is a bill before the Wisconsin Assembly which would make it mandatory for psychologists to be paid in the same way as psychiatrists. I am taking the liberty of enclosing an additional sheet of paper explaining the bill. Obviously the savings to the Diocese and to many of the religious communities would be great if the bill were enacted. While I fully understand that the Chancery cannot take a position supporting one profession against another at least you might cheer us on silently.

Again, I wish you would take the time to personally reassure the Most Reverend Archbishop that we attempt to waste no time in the resolution of problems; human beings are simply too complex to do it as quickly as any of us would like.

AGREEMENT AND MUTUAL RELEASE

This Agreement and Mutual Release (hereafter "Agreement") is made by and between (hereafter), and the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Milwaukee, and all of its affiliated entities, schools, and parishes (hereafter "Archdiocese"). has brought to the attention of the Archdiocese that he was sexually abused by Siegfried Widera (hereafter "Widera"), a former priest of the Archdiocese, when was a minor.

and the Archdiocese entered into mediation to achieve reconciliation and restoration, to help repair the harm to and to otherwise resolve and settle all disputes between them.

Accordingly, the parties to this Agreement wish to resolve and satisfy all claims of any nature that has against the Archdiocese, and all of the Archdiocese's employees, agents, insurers, officers, directors, affiliates, and assigns, including, without limitation, all members of the Roman Catholic clergy and all parishes, schools, and religious orders, and any person or entity affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church in the territory of the Archdiocese, arising from the sexual abuse of by Widera without the necessity of further proceedings or expense of any nature, and all parties wish to generally release one another from all liability for any claims that may exist to the date of the signing of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, any claims for sexual abuse of by Widera.

So, in consideration of the mutual promises made here, and other valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties to this Agreement agree as follows:

- 1. The Archdiocese agrees to provide with \$50,000. These funds shall be used at discretion.
- 2. The Archdiocese further agrees to provide with \$38,000 to assist with debts and loss of employment income that are directly related to emotional distress of dealing with the abuse by Widera.
- 3. The Archdiocese further agrees that Archbishop Timothy Dolan will meet with at a mutually agreed upon time and place and that will initiate plans for this meeting by contacting Amy Peterson.
- 4. associated with the settlement, and there will be no payment to other than that specifically enumerated in these paragraphs.



Widera were alone in the pool area at the time of the abuse. Fr. Widera took off his swimming trunks at one point. Widera said he became rebellious at that age. went on a road trip with the teacher. They drove out west, possibly to Texas. During what said he felt shamed, guilty, and felt a sense of distrust. While in his teens, mother either showed him an article or told him that Fr. Widera had abused a fourteen year old boy. remembered the

times that he was with Fr. Widera, and because he was older, realized that some of the things Fr. Widera did with him and others were not appropriate. still did not tell anyone about the abuses at that time. He believes that he was around twenty years old when he first told his mother and then about the abuse by Fr. Widera. that he was abused by Fr. Widera. wife, said about three or four years ago, a male and female detective from the West Allis Police Department came to his house and questioned him about being sexually abused by Fr. Widera. 

Fr. Siegfried Widera was ordained to the priesthood on May 20, 1967, and was assigned to St. Mary Help of Christians Church in West Allis as an associate pastor. He was there until June of 1972, at which time he was transferred to St. Mary's Parish in Port Washington. In July of 1973, Fr. Widera was charged with and pled guilty to sexually assaulting a fourteen year old boy. On August 13, 1973, he was placed on three years of probation, and ordered by the judge to stay out of the Port Washington area.

According to the Superior Court of Orange County, California, case number in early September of 1973 Fr. Widera was assigned to help out at St. Andrew's Parish in Delavan, WI. In June of 1976, another allegation of sexual abuse had been made against Fr. Widera by the parents of a fourteen year old boy. On August 20, 1976, Fr. Henke, the pastor of St. Andrew's Parish, reported to the Archdiocesan Personnel Board that Fr. Widera had an incident with an eleven year old boy a couple of months earlier. Shortly after this, Fr. Widera left for Costa Mesa, CA, where his brother lived. Fr. Widera served as a priest in California until he was removed from the ministry in 1985 after he was again accused of sexual misconduct.

In early April 2002, an Orange County man filed a lawsuit against Fr. Widera, alleging the priest had molested him and his brother in 1985. The news accounts detailed Fr. Widera's past, and additional victims stepped forward in Milwaukee, WI, and Orange County, CA. On May 24, 2002, the Milwaukee District Attorney's Office charged Fr. Widera with nine felony counts of Enticing A Child For Immoral Purposes and/or Indecent Behavior With a Child, case number.

A Wisconsin arrest warrant for Fr. Widera was issued. Those charges stemmed from Fr. Widera's assignment at St. Mary Help of Christians Church in West Allis, and involved three boys. After the charges were issued, Fr. Widera disappeared. According to the

U.S. Marshall's Office, Fr. Widera obtained a six month permit for his car to enter Mexico on July 12, 2002, and crossed the border in Ciudad Juarez. Ten months later, on May 25, 2003, Mexican law enforcement officials located Fr. Widera in Mazatlan, Mexico. They took him to a room at the Vista Dorada Hotel for questioning. Later that afternoon, Fr. Widera jumped from the third floor of the hotel to his death. In addition to the Wisconsin charges, Fr. Widera was wanted on thirty three felony counts of child molestation in California at the time of his death.

Additional investigation: West Allis Police Department Incident Report #

detectives from the West Allis Police Department contacted him. They questioned about the possibility that may have been sexually abused by Fr. Widera. stated he did not know how his name as a potential victim would have surfaced.

A check with the West Allis Police Department found that there is a report on file regarding a sexual assault investigation involving Fr. Widera as a suspect. I obtained a copy of that report through open records. The report, Incident # is titled, 1st Degree Sexual Assault of a Child (by Priest). The ninety-one page report, which is a series of individual reports made during the investigation, is dated from April 24, 2002 through April 12, 2004. There is extensive blacking out of the names, ages, and addresses of the victims and what appears to be anyone related to the victims. This West Allis investigation was the basis for the Milwaukee District Attorney's Office to charge Fr. Widera with the four felony counts of Enticing A Child For Immoral Purposes and the five felony counts of Indecent Behavior With a Child, case number

The report indicated that the offenses occurred between January 1, 1969 and September 1, 1976, at the following locations: 1210 S. 61st St., West Allis, WI (St. Mary Help of Christians Catholic Church and rectory); 6014 W. Madison St., West Allis, WI (St. Mary Help of Christians gymnasium); 1669-1673 S. 108th St., West Allis, WI (formerly the Tyrolean Towne House Inn); and at 2401 W. Wisconsin Av., Milwaukee, WI (formerly the Eagles Club).

The West Allis sexual assault investigation began on April 24, 2002. A male victim came into the West Allis Police Department to report that Fr. Widera had sexually assaulted him. He reported that some of the sexual assaults which involved inappropriate touching occurred in

Fr. Widera's bedroom at the rectory of St. Mary Help of Christians Parish, starting in early 1970; (page 11). It was also at the rectory that Fr. Widera first gave him a pomographic magazine to look at; (page 14). The reporting victim told detectives that Fr. Widera had a membership at the Eagles Club, and would often take him there to go swimming, especially between 1970 and 1972. He was sexually assaulted on some of those occasions; (pages 18-19).

A second victim that West Allis detectives interviewed during the investigation reported being sexually abused by Fr. Widera while at a swimming pool. The victim stated, "He would rub his genitals against us – like a dog (humping)!" The victim also told detectives that Fr. Widera provided pornographic magazines to him. The report states, "The magazines showed graphic photos of nude women. WIDERA provided these magazines to [name blacked out] between January – March 1970 through May or June 1972"; (page 24). The second victim remembers going swimming at the Eagles Club with Fr. Widera, and remembers the sauna, but said he was never molested at the Eagles Club; (page 25).

On page 30 of the West Allis police report is a heading titled, "Possible Additional Victims/Witnesses". The narrative states, "On 05-01-2002, [name blacked out] told me that he remembered the names of three altar boys that went on trips with them and might have also been victimized by Father WIDERA. They are: [names blacked out]". The next paragraph in the report is an interview the West Allis detectives conducted on 05-05-2002. The interview is with wife, Her first name was inadvertently not blacked out near the end of the interview. In addition, the detectives made a reference to an arrest and two restraining orders filed by priests or other church members, which is listed on CCAP under name. It is apparent the detectives were trying to make contact with but he was not living with told the detectives that [name blacked out] is a very devout

person who was committed to God, and would sometimes get in trouble when he saw somebody or something in the Church that he did not think was right. She asked the detectives if they were there to investigate [name blacked out]. The detectives told that they were investigating a priest. She stated, "Well that's funny. We (she and [name blacked out]) just talked on the phone the other day about the priest that abused [name blacked out]. He (the priest) was in the news".

The next interview, on page 31 of the police report, took place on 05-08-2002. It is the statement of a victim/witness. Based on the location of this interview in the report, as well as, the content of the interview, it is clear that was the person interviewed by the West Allis detectives. There is a sentence in the first paragraph that states, "[Name blacked out] is very religious and when I initially contacted him, he did not want to talk to me as he did not want to hurt his religion with any more abuse revelations". The next paragraph relates to his family. "He desperately wanted a father in his life. [Name blacked out] said that Father WIDERA was that father figure in his life for about one year. [Name blacked out] added that he only attended

provided the detectives with a phone number where they could contact him.

[blacked out] grade at ST MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS parish school because his mother moved the family after that". Italied about Fr. Widera's red and white Volkswagen bus and the smell of yeast from a certain section of the freeway. The report states, "This memory was special to [name blacked out] because Father WIDERA would place [name blacked out] on his lap and allow [name blacked out] to steer while driving in this area of the expressway".

told the detectives that one time Fr. Widera took him to the Eagles Club to go swimming. "He (WIDERA) took his trunks off and swam around the pool naked. Then he took my trunks off and held me close to his body. He looked at my body and hugged me". indicated that it happened only once while swimming, but he remembered feeling very uncomfortable about it.

The interview further indicated that Fr. Widera took into his bedroom at the rectory at St. Mary Help of Christians Parish, where was exposed to pornography. "[Name blacked out] said that sometimes Father WIDERA would get out some Playboy and Penthouse magazines. Father would allow [name blacked out] to page through them on the bed and look at the pictures. [Name blacked out] told us that Father WIDERA would usually take his trousers off and lie on the bed next to [name blacked out]. WIDERA would watch [name blacked out] as [name blacked out] looked at the pictures in the magazines. [Name blacked out] thought that Father might have undressed him [name blacked out] down to his underwear too (when the magazines came out) but [name blacked out] was not certain. [Name blacked out] stated, 'I really didn't understand what he (WIDERA) was doing'". told the detectives that it didn't happen all the time, just once in awhile.

During the interview, talked about the Florida trip that he went on with Fr. Widera.

The report states, "[Name blacked out] told me that for the most part, Father WIDERA was very

good to him and just had occasional incidents where he did things that made [name blacked out] uncomfortable. [Name blacked out] said that Father WIDERA even took him and another boy to Florida on vacation. [Name blacked out] estimated that the trip would have been taken in the summer of 1968 or 1969. [Name blacked out] told me that was the first time he had ever been to Florida. [Name blacked out] said that Father would allow him to look at pornographic magazines at the rest stops but for the most part, Father seemed more interested in the other boy. [Name blacked out] does not remember that boy's name or anything about him — only that the other boy was older that he [name blacked out] was".

There is another interview with an abuse victim on page 66 of the West Allis police report. That victim attended St. Mary Help of Christians Parish and spent time with Fr. Widera. The victim talked about going swimming with Fr. Widera, and of being tickled and touched inappropriately by Fr. Widera while the victim was naked. He further talked about going places with Fr. Widera, such as to his parent's house in South Milwaukee. The report also states, "[Name blacked out] told me that Father WIDERA had wanted to take him on a trip to Florida one summer but [name blacked out] dad said no right away. At the time [name blacked out] was disappointed that he could not go and did not understand why his father said no. To the best of [name blacked out] knowledge, his father never indicated or stated if he suspected WIDERA of any inappropriate conduct".

There is a section towards the beginning of the West Allis police report entitled: CHARGING SYNOPSIS. It appears that a paragraph in that section of the report is a summary of the detectives' investigation relating to The paragraph on page 7 states, "[Name blacked out] thought he was around [blacked out] or [blacked out] years old when he was sexually molested by WIDERA. [Name blacked out] estimated that the assaults occurred in

1968 or 1969; however, both the [name blacked out] brothers recall [name blacked out] going on trips with them and Father WIDERA and [name blacked out] was in the [blacked out] so the assaults most likely occurred during the 1970-1971 school year, when [name blacked out] was [blacked out] years old. [Name blacked out] said that he witnessed Father WIDERA touch [name blacked out] genitals over [name blacked out] clothing inside the Sacristy after mass. Father WIDERA also provided pornographic magazines for [name blacked out] to look through while both he and WIDERA were lying on WIDERA's bed, partially unclothed in the Rectory. [Name blacked out] said that he remembered Father WIDERA took him swimming at THE EAGLES CLUB and removed [name blacked out] swim trunks. WIDERA held [name blacked out] naked body against his own in the pool".

In May of 2002, West Allis detectives contacted as a possible sexual assault victim, while conducting an investigation regarding Fr. Widera. They were led to through an interview with another victim. The West Allis detectives filed a report that contained numerous interviews from other victims or witnesses. Those interviews showed that Fr. Widera did provide pornographic magazines to young boys, he did take boys swimming at the Eagles Club, he did take boys on trips across the country, he did have a red Volkswagen bus, and he did touch boys inappropriately, both over their clothing and by skin to skin contact. The West Allis police report verifies that other young boys at St. Mary Help of Christians Parish were sexually abused by Fr. Widera in the same manner as described.

never talked to anyone about the sexual abuse in detail, until he was approached and questioned by the West Allis detectives in May of 2002. There is indication that his mother and sisters were aware of the sexual abuse in the 1970's. wife learned about the abuse in the late 1980's or early 1990's. does not have a close knit family, but they, along with his wife, believe he is telling the truth.

is very religious. Some people believe that he takes his religion to the extreme. Nevertheless, is credible and appears to be sincere. After talking to Father Videra for a considerable length of time he did admit the he had played with a number of boys privates and that he had allowed at least two or these boys to commit an act of sodomy on him. He stated that this was to help them in their curisoty about sex. These acts of sodomy were committed in Ozaukee County on STH 84, on STH 57 and possibly on CTH K. The Bishop of Orange has invited him to seek incardination and he wanted to know what procedure there would be. It is now approximately five years that he has been gone from the diocese following psychological problems. He states that he has not received any further professional help in California but he intends to do so in the near future. He

He likes it there and seems to be getting along well with the priests and the people of the diocese. He has a brother living very near to his rectory with whom he associates at least once a week. The rest of his family has split up and are in various parts of the country. Only one brother remains here in Milwaukee. I told him that I wanted to discuss this further with the Archbishop and the Personnel Board but at the same time I encouraged him to write me a letter of formal request for this. We have gotten along successfully without him for four or five years and I think that we ought to let him join the Grange Diocese for his good and the good of this Archdiocese.

Select Widera Sexual Abuse Intake Reports

- Sexual Abuse Intake Report alleging abuse by Widera at St. Mary's and various locations around Wisconsin from 1969-1976 when the survivor was 9-16 years old. Widera touched the survivor's genitals and put his genitals between the survivor's legs and masturbated.
- 7/31/03 Sexual Abuse Intake Report alleging abuse by Widera at St. Mary's in 1971-1972 when the survivor was 11-12 years old. Widera hugged her, kissed her, and forced her to undress. On several occasions Widera forced her to touch his penis and rubbed her hand on his penis until he ejaculated.
- 12/22/03 Sexual Abuse Intake Report alleging abuse by Widera at St. Mary's in 1969-1970 when the survivor was 8-9 years old. Widera touched the survivor's genitals on a number of occasions.
- 4/29/04 Sexual Abuse Intake Report alleging abuse by Widera at St. Mary's in 1973 when the survivor was 8 years old. Widera forced the survivor to put his mouth on Widera's penis and Widera also touched the survivor's penis. The abuse took place a number of times in the rectory, Widera's car, and at St. Mary's. Says there were other boys in the neighborhood who were molested by Widera. Archdiocese will provide financial assistance with therapy and the survivor will proceed with mediation.
- 7/7/05 Sexual Abuse Intake Report alleging abuse by Widera while he was at St. Mary's in Port Washington, WI in 1971-1973 when the survivor was approximately 11-13 years old. Widera touched and rubbed the survivor's buttocks and he locked the survivor in a dark room with other girls and touched the survivor's chest.
