



1. Cut up colorful paper into little pieces. The larger sizes will be easier for younger children to use, while smaller pieces will allow for more creativity with older children.

\***Pro tip:** Cut your large piece of colorful paper into long strips before cutting into smaller shapes. It will go smoother and allow you to cut out a variety of shapes/sizes of paper. \**If you do not have colorful paper, you may color a piece of white paper with a crayon or marker, and then cut it up.* 

2. Draw an outline of a rose. You may also print one out, if that is easier for you. Keep the outline large with plenty of space in which to glue paper pieces.

3. Place some glue on the rose outline, and then put a piece of colorful paper on that spot. Repeat these steps until the shape is covered. There is no wrong way to do this, so allow plenty of room for creativity with your child(ren).

Bonus: Save all of the leftover pieces of colorful paper for another mosaic project on the next rainy day!
