

Greetings! My name is Margaret Calteaux and I was born and raised in a loving, Catholic family of five children in "the other east-side of Milwaukee", called Bay View. Each of the children in my family attended at least sixteen years at the private, Catholic schools. I am the second oldest and the only one who is Hard of Hearing. With my hearing loss and the values that I've learned, I was always



sensitive and conscious of little details and did not let my hearing loss prevented me to live my life and appreciate the life of others. I am a member of St. Paul the Apostles Catholic Church in Racine. Over the years, I volunteered helping out with the Religious Education classes, involved with Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) "SEARCH" group, attended the Christian Outdoor Leadership School (COLS) near Colorado Springs, CO, worked in campus ministry as Eucharist minister, volunteered as a counselor at Camp Vista for disabled children, volunteered as a Service Support Provider (SSP) at the American Association for the Deaf-Blind (AADB) conferences since 1995, made Cursillo retreat #59 in 2005 and currently volunteering at various events throughout the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. I also served as officer or involved with various committees for International Catholic Deaf Association – United States Section (ICDA-US), National Catholic Office for the Deaf (NCOD), Wisconsin Association of the Deaf (WAD), Greater Milwaukee Association of the Deaf (GMAD), Ephpheta Sodality of St. John the Baptist/ICDA #7, and Racine-Kenosha Club of the Deaf (RKCD). I completed the Ministry Formation Program (MFP) with the Deaf in Chicago in 2010 and received Master Degree in Pastoral Ministry - Specialized in Deaf Ministry from St. Thomas University in Miami, FL in 2012. I am currently working at the Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC) as a computer support specialist in the help-desk department for almost 30 years. I praise God for the gifts He has given me to do His work within the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Catholic community. Over the years I wanted and tried to give back to the communities to show them how grateful I am.

My NCOD Pastoral Week Experience - By Mary Ellen Martens



It was my first exposure to NCOD in Costa Mesa, California in 2002, but it took me twelve years to return. Last January 16th I escaped lethargic weather to attend the National Catholic Office of the Deaf convention in Las Vegas. We were blessed with sunny weather with 70° F. Our hotel, Palace Station, was off the strip about 4 miles away; its owner is the personal friend of Bishop Pepe from the Diocese of Las Vegas. We had Mass daily with different celebrants: 2 Bishops, 3 Deaf priests and 2 hearing priests who are proficient in sign language. The first day started with Bishop

Rhodes from Diocese of South Bend, Indiana and on Sunday with Bishop Pepe officiating at a Deaf church 8 miles away. Moreover, each day commenced by prayer service and no prayer was the same each day. Some evenings were free and most of us were at the strip.

Patty Slisz shared with me about a church near the strip. I walked to the Cathedral of Guardian Angels where Bishop Pepe resides. In the past up to the time of erection of the tall hotel, the Cathedral was visible for the streets and now it is obscurely hidden by hotel Wynn. I was in awe with the architecture of the church; it is a pyramid-like structure. I was fascinated with the murals of the five angels representing the five senses (See, Hear, Smell, Taste, and Feel). From there I walked all the way to the tallest building called Stratosphere where I could view 360 degrees of the city. On the antenna tower there were wild and daring rides. I didn't venture because of faint heart.



The seminars were very inspiring and enriching. The first seminar given by Fr. Thomas Coughlin was about forgiveness. After that, some people came to the stage to share their angers and "let it go". They felt relieved. I was moved to tears. Fr. Christopher Klusman lectured about "Theology of the Body: and it focused on our bodies and holiness. Fr. Michael Depcik and Kid Black mentioned that the implement interpreters real important. Fr. Depcik realized he couldn't get enough information without an interpreter, especially with his boss and staff in the Archdiocese of Detroit. I learned something new from each of the seven presentations.



On Martin Luther King Day, we had an afternoon free. Most attendees took a tour to Hoover Dam. My former schoolmate, Gail, her husband Bob, I drove to the West Rim of the Grand Canyon, operating by the Hualapai Nation. The drive took three hours each way; we finally achieved our goal to walk on the skywalk. As we inched slowly, we stared through the glassy floor and could see the canyon floor 4,000 feet below. We were feeling like "suspended in the air". Besides skywalk, we absorbed multicolored canyons as we aahed and oohed. On the way back, we stopped by Hover Dam because Gail wanted to see it. I liked the new bridge overlooking the

dam to ease the traffic flow; the design of the bridge is , indeed, an engineering fest.

Next year NCOD convention will take place in San Diego.

Hi,

As for the Las Vegas NCOD, it was GREAT! I wasn't sure about going there, because it was a last minute thing for me when I found out about in December, a month before I went.

I had met people from all over the country, and I had learned a lot from talking to people, of their life experiences, and what they have done and did, etc. with church and in life in general, how church and God has helped in their lives.

Fr. Mike Depick, he gave a good talk, and made sense, when he had said we deaf people need hearing people's support on our events, even though deaf people want to do it all alone. We cannot, because hearing people have more knowledge, and can help us deaf people run things, which makes a lot of sense.

They also talked about human trafficking, and how it is happening right now in the United States, and how to stop it, etc. They also talked about addiction to things, such as drugs, alcohol, etc. It sure made me appreciate my life, even though I may not be as successful as I wanted to be, but after listening to everything, I am glad I'm a Catholic, and appreciate it all.

It was great to have met Fr. Shawn from Boston, Fr. Paul from San Francisco, Fr. Tom Coughlin, etc. It was so cool to meet other deaf priests, who have a better connection with other deaf people, such as me!

I thought Fr. Chris' talk about the Theology of the Body was great, only because it made more sense, and now I can see why the whole world, and especially the United States, is so messed up on family, life, and marriage. I can see now why so many people get divorces, have bad relationships, and many other problems. That is too bad.

Last thing, I loved Fr. Tom Coughlin's talk about forgiveness. He told us that we have to forgive people, even when they have hurt us the most. He told us that we cannot hold grudges or seek revenge against those who have hurt us the most, but to forgive, or God won't forgive us, which is true, and I forget that sometimes. There were two people who forgave a person, and admitted on stage, that it took them years to forgive that one person who have seriously wronged them, and I was impressed that those two people forgave the bad person. If it was me in that situation, I don't know what I would have done.

I will now save up to go to the next NCOD in San Diego, next year!

Have you seen different kinds of Icon Crucifix at some Catholic and Eastern Churches, monasteries, Catholic universities, and some Catholic stores? In this particular Icon cross, called The San Damiano Crucifix which I had an opportunity to share it with you as it has great history and symbolism in the Icon. Tim Gall and I had time and prepared for the interesting presentation with photo slides and talked about The San Damiano Crucifix in front of about 30 curiously audiences at St. Romans Church in Milwaukee last Feb. 22. In first part of presentation, I briefly introduced a short biography of St. Francis of Assisi who was awakened to new zeal (passion) after he knelt, prayed and glazed at this very



old 12th Century wooden San Damiano Crucifix inside of old worn out San Damiano Church. This Crucifix, when the image of Christ in the Crucifix miraculously spoke with his lips move and heard the words, "Go repair my Church, which as you see is falling completely in ruin". Francis responded, "Gladly will I do so, Lord ".

In Second part of presentation, I explained several symbolism in the Icon, which was painted in similar figures during the twelfth century in Umbria. The purpose of icon cross to teach the meaning of the event depicted and strengthen the faith of the people. In many centuries ago, many civilian people across the country can not read and write their own languages, were often relied on many icons such as small wooden panels, statues, painted mural, mosaic, and stained glass for their interpretations. In the end, we had a good discussion about our Catholic faith regards of many Icons in our Catholic communities exposed to our World!

Lastly, we had a nice fellowship time with great pizza and drinks and we walked straight to our Signed Mass which was celebrated by Fr. Christopher Klusman! De Colores!




