INTRODUCTION

OPENING PRAYER

Priest: Brothers & Sisters, God calls us to conversion, let us therefore ask him for the grace of sincere repentance. *(silence)*

Graciously hear the prayers of those who call on you, we ask, O Lord, and forgive the sins of those who confess to you, granting us in your kindness both pardon and peace. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. All: Amen.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Ezekiel 34:11-16

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel.

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I will lead them out from among the peoples and gather them from the foreign lands; I will bring them back to their own country and pasture them upon the mountains of Israel in the land's ravines and all its inhabited places. In good pastures will I pasture them, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing ground. There they shall lie down on good grazing ground, and in rich pastures shall they be pastured on the mountains of Israel. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal. but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Philippians.

And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance."

HOMILY

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

Priest: My dear friends, as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises this Easter, we bring our hearts and minds, our very selves, before the Lord.

Reader 1: Are you lost? (pause) Why? (pause)

Quite often when we feel lost, we are ashamed of something...ashamed of what we have done...or ashamed of what we have failed to do. Our sense of shame and being lost prevents us from turning to God.

Take heart! God is near. God seeks us out and finds us.

And when God finds us, there is great rejoicing!

(sung refrain – refrain for Psalm 103 suggested)

Reader 2:

- For the times I have avoided responsibility to care for another...for the times I have ignored someone's cry for help...
-) For the times I give in to feelings of jealousy...for the times my jealousy has ruled my words or actions...
-) For the times I give in to feelings of fear and mistrust...for the times I choose not to speak out against injustice...

(sung refrain)

Reader 1:

) For the times I judge myself and others harshly...

) For the times I feel lost and turn away from God...

) For the times I allow my shame to block God's Love in my life...

(sung refrain)

Reader 2:

) For the times I did not recognize the need for healing and forgiveness...

) For the times I failed to seek repentance...

) For the times I caused pain and hurt to myself and others...

(sung refrain)

RITE OF RECONCILIATION

GENERAL CONFESSION OF SINS

Presider: Brothers and Sisters,

Let us call to mind the goodness of God our Father as we acknowledge our sins, so that we may receive his merciful forgiveness.

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore, I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

LORD'S PRAYER

Priest: We join in prayer to the Father, asking him to forgive us as we forgive others...**Our Father...**

Priest: Jesus said, "there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance." My friends, may we now experience God's forgiveness and joy gifts that leads to new life!

All: Amen.

INDIVIDUAL CONFESSION OF SIN & ABSOLUTION

The priest or another minister instructs the assembly where the confessors will be located. A brief word regarding the manner of confession may be given. If there is to be a common ending, the assembly should be advised to remain in church for the Proclamation of Praise and Concluding Rite. If there is no common ending, the **Concluding Rite** precedes Individual Confession and Absolution.

PROCLAMATION OF PRAISE

When individual confessions have been completed, the assembly is invited to offer thanks and encouraged to do good works which will proclaim the grace of repentance in the life of the entire community and each of its members. It is especially fitting for all to sing a psalm or hymn which acknowledges God's mercy.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Priest: Almighty Father,you have shown us your mercyand made us a new creationin the likeness of your Son.Make us living signs of your lovefor the whole world to see.We ask this through Christ our Lord.All: Amen.

CONCLUDING RITE

BLESSING

Priest: May the Lord guide your hearts in the way of his love and fill you with Christ-like patience.

All: Amen.

Priest: May he give you strength to walk in newness of life and to please him in all things.

All: Amen.

Priest: May almighty God bless you,the Father, and the Son, (+) and the Holy Spirit.All: Amen.

DISMISSAL

Priest: The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go in peace.

All: Thanks be to God.

INDIVIDUAL CONFESSION OF SIN & ABSOLUTION

SOME IDEAS FOR PENANCES...

Feed the Hungry; Give Drink to the Thirsty

-) Donate food to a food pantry
-) Volunteer at a soup kitchen
-) Prepare a meal for a family during their time of need

Clothe the Naked

-) Go through your drawers and closets and find good-condition clothes to donate to St. Vincent de Paul, the Salvation Army or Goodwill
-) Reach out to neighbors that have lost their possessions in fires, floods, or other natural disasters
-) Donate clothing and shoes

Visit the Sick

-) Cook and deliver a meal to a sick, elderly or homebound relative or friend
-) Volunteer to drive a sick relative or neighbor to a medical appointment or treatment facility
-) Spend quality time with someone who is homebound or confined to a nursing home

Shelter the Homeless

) Donate blankets to a homeless shelter

) Assist with cooking a meal at a homeless shelter

) Throw your coin change into a jar and periodically donate it to a charity that tends to the needs of the poor and homeless

Visit the Imprisoned

-) Donate books to a jail library
-) Pray for the families of people in jail
-) Guard against racism, practice inclusion—not exclusion, and be mindful that all are members of the human race and equal in God's eyes

Bury the Dead

) Visit a cemetery & place flowers on a grave that has none

) Assist with a bereavement luncheon or minister at a funeral

) Spend time with widows and widowers
