SAFE ENVIRONMENT WEEK

Every year, the Archdiocese of Milwaukee focuses one week in April on raising awareness of our child abuse prevention efforts. We honor this week to pray for healing for all those that are survivors of abuse and for all of us that work to create a culture of awareness in our parishes, schools, clergy and staff. This year, the Archdiocese of Milwaukee will celebrate Safe Environment Week from March 30 - April 6. We invite you to join the Safe Environment Office in recognizing this week and reflecting on your own department's programs, processes and events.

There are several opportunities for MMCPC staff to join us in raising awareness, including:

- Participating in the Safe Environment Week Jeans Days fundraiser through HR. Funds donated will go to Aurora Health Care's Healing & Advocacy Services, who provide support, services and resources to victims of abuse. Contact Angie Doney in HR about participating.
- Pray a Rosary for healing or do a novena for protection and healing from abuse for survivors and those that journey with them.
- Wear a blue ribbon as a reminder that we all share the responsibility to prevent child abuse. Blue is the color of Child Abuse Prevention Awareness.
- If you have children or grandchildren, have a conversation with them. Offer positive affirmation and listen to them share a story or experience.

The rumors are true - Saint Francis de Sales Seminary is moving to the MMCPC!

In a few weeks, construction to restore and expand the seminary's historic buildings to accommodate the seminary's significant growth will begin. Seminarians, priests in residence and staff will need to vacate the seminary for the next 18 months. We are happy to welcome them to the Mary Mother of the Church Pastoral Center. For many of us, this move to the MMCPC will not impact our daily lives; but we wanted to let you know what space the seminary will be using and the timeline for their move.

The seminary will be using the following space: Aquinas Hall (aka. The Retreat Center), B208, B209, Milwaukee Bucks Wing, K Wing Dining Room, Kitchen and the second floor of the L Wing. We will also be sharing Dining Room 1 and 2, along with Parking Lot 5 (the back parking lot).

The main entrance to the seminary space will be the old Milwaukee Bucks Entrance at the back of the building. Seminary guests will be directed to use the service drive (the entrance located across from the FBI

building). Updated signage will be going in over the next few months to direct guests to the seminary entrance.

Some furniture, liturgical items and items for storage will begin to be moved the week of April 14. Seminary staff will begin to move and set up their offices in the balcony level of the Milwaukee Bucks Wing around April 24. Seminarians and priests in residence will begin to move their items in mid-May. Seminarians will take up residence at the start of the new academic year.

Jenni Oliva will be working with seminary staff to make sure that the shared space is scheduled in advance. There may be some growing pains, but we ask for your patience as we figure out this new arrangement.

We ask that staff and tenants of the MMCPC be respectful of the seminarians, priests in residence and staff. For the priests in residence and seminarians the MMCPC is their new home, and we need to treat it like anyone's house. Please do not enter seminary space unless invited to do so by Seminary Leadership.

As pilgrims, we are profoundly grateful that you are welcoming us to the Mary Mother of the Church Pastoral Center.
