

The following is the finding aid for the St. Francis Seminary Photograph Album collection located at the Archdiocese of Milwaukee Archives. A finding aid is a catalog tool used in archives that briefly describes the material found in a collection. These records are not available digitally unless otherwise noted. Researchers must make an appointment with an archivist to view the material.

**Scope and Content** *a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.* 

Box 1 contains St. Francis Seminary albums (c1918-1951). These albums contain photographs of the seminary buildings and grounds, students, faculty, and events. Programs for plays and events are also found within the seminary albums. Box 2 contains seven undated and largely unidentified photograph albums. The albums appear to date from the 1860s to just before the turn of the century. The albums are of a personal nature, containing photographs of family and friends from both the Milwaukee area and abroad.

**Box List** This is a list of album descriptions within the collection. The albums have been arranged roughly chronologically. Box 1 contains dated St. Francis Seminary photograph albums arranged largely in chronological order. Box 2 contains undated/unidentified albums. "B" is an abbreviation for box. This list will help the researcher narrow down exactly what folder they want to look at.
