Open/unrestricted except for marriage case files, payroll records, and student transcripts.

Historical Note

St. Nicholas parish was founded in 1933 as a mission church. The land that was purchased for the parish included a tinsmith's shop. The small "tin-shop" church was furnished with donations from several neighborhood parishes.

Fr. Stehling believed deeply in the importance of Catholic education so he moved the parish to its new location on Green Bay Avenue and began building the grade school. The school opened in 1950 with 106 students and four School Sisters of Notre Dame. Masses were held in the basement of the church until a new church could be built in 1956, the same year it obtained parish status.

The parish council was formed in 1974, and throughout the 1970s and 1980s several new organizations and committees were formed. By 1990 the number of parishioners was down to 750. In 1992, the parish merged with Holy Redeemer and St. Albert to form Blessed Trinity Parish. In 2011, Blessed Trinity merged into St. Catherine (51st & Center) in Milwaukee.

Scope and Content *a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.*

The collection consists of records of a northside Milwaukee parish that was founded in 1933 and merged with two other parishes (St. Albert Congregation, Holy Redeemer Congregation) in 1992. Strengths of the collection include parish bulletins (1963-1992) and parish council minutes (1978-1992).
