## **Biographical Note**

Joseph E. Emmengger was born on January 30<sup>th</sup>, 1917. He studied at St. Francis Seminary from 1930-1937, at North American College in Rome from 1937-1940, and at Catholic University in Washington D.C. from 1940-1942. He was ordained to priesthood on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 1942 at St. Ann's Church in Milwaukee, WI. He served as vice-chancellor and secretary to Archbishop from 1948-1955. He was appointed Rector of Graduate House of North American College in Rome in 1955 and served in that office until 1961. He served as pastor at St. Andrew's Parish in Delavan from 1961-1965, pastor at St. Matthias Parish in Milwaukee from 1965-1974, and pastor at St. Mary in Elm Grove from 1974 until his retirement in 1992. Archbishop Weakland appointed him to the Catholic Herald Working Board in 1993. Joseph E. Emmenger died on January 15th, 2000.

## **Scope and Content** a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.

This collection is comprised almost entirely of course materials, sermons, and photographs. Course materials from Religious Education Program: Teacher Training Theology course at St. Matthias. Sermons are organized by subject, according to the original categories used by Emmengger. Most sermons are undated. Some sermons are written in Italian. Many of the photographs are from his time in Rome, and include dignitaries such as popes, and Vice-president Nixon.
