Biographical Note

Rev. Harold Ide was born on May 26, 1928 at Kenosha, Wisconsin. He attended St. Francis Minor and Major Seminary from 1941 until 1952. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 31, 1952 by the Most Reverend Moses E. Kiley at Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in Milwaukee.

On August 5, 1952 Fr. began his priestly ministry as an assistant at St. James Parish in Kenosha. On February 25, 1972 Fr. Ide was appointed to his first pastorate at Holy Family Parish in Whitefish Bay. On June 12, 1973 he became Vicar for Education for the Diocese of Phoenix in Arizona. Fr. Ide was named Assistant Treasurer for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in June of 1974 and pastor at St. James Parish in Menomonee Falls on August 4, 1981. His last assignment before retiring was Administrator of St. Mary Parish, Cascade, with the mission of St. Michael in Mitchell on June 22, 1993. He retired from active ministry on June 18, 1996. Fr. Ide died on May 15, 2003.
