

The following is the finding aid for the Newspaper Scrapbooks collection located at the Archdiocese of Milwaukee Archives. A finding aid is a catalog tool used in archives that briefly describes the material found in a collection. These records are not available digitally unless otherwise noted.

Scope and Content *a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.*

The historical newspaper scrapbooks collection consists of compilation scrapbooks containing news stories relating to various topics. Most of the collection is written in English but some articles are in German script; articles in German have not been indexed or identified.

Scrapbook #1 contains newsclippings that span the period of Archbishop Messmer as Archbishop of Milwaukee, 1903-1930. Topics includes social issues of the day including women's suffrage and prohibition, anniversaries of archdiocesan priests, parishes, and religious orders and events specific to the archdiocese such as the purchase of the Pabsts Mansion and Polish Catholics conflicts. Specific article titles can be found below.

Scrapbook #2 consists widely of topics specific to the Diocese of Green Bay during the 1890s. Specific article titles can be found below.

Scrapbook #3 offers articles relating to a wide variety of topics and issues during the 1870s-1890s; not all articles relate to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee or Catholicism. Several letters to the editor of *The Sentinel*, written by Rev. Fagan of Immacualte Conception Parish, Milwaukee are included.

Scrapbook #4 contains mostly German articles. There are a few English articles about Catholic Schools.

Scrapbook #5 relates to anti-Catholicism, anti-Germans and the Bennett Law.
