## HOW TO START:

- Pick one other period of diocesan history, and learn about important events that happened during this time period, as well as some key people during that time period.
- The Archdiocese of Milwaukee is currently made up of 10 counties. Name all 10 counties within Archdiocese's jurisdiction.
- There have been 11 Archbishops since the creation of the Diocese of Milwaukee. Name all 11 Archbishops.
