Our Goal and Principles Remain the Same. . .

- Our goal = to make disciples
- 6 Tasks of Catechesis working together
 - Promoting knowledge of the faith
 - Liturgical education
 - Moral formation
 - Teaching to pray
 - Education for Community Life
 - Missionary initiation
- Always in context of family and the community
- Developmentally appropriate
- ... But conditions have changed, so we need to consider new settings and methods of faith formation.

Settings in General

- 1. **Face-to-face programs**, as in the past grade-level classes, family program, parent sessions.
- 2. **Face-to-face, with limitations** smaller groups, social distance, staggered times, careful interactions.
- 3. **Home-based formation** resources & guidance for parents to foster learning and prayer in the family.
- 4. Online classes for older students or for families.

- At-parish or At-home?
- Family-focused or age-specific?

9 Settings / Methods that may be used, depending on circumstances

Flipped Classroom

- Asynchronous Input
- In person or virtual session to discuss, process, apply

Smaller Groups – Staggered / Alternate Times

• Age specific • Gathered • Real-time • At Parish

• Family-focused • Asynchronous • At Home

Hybrid Groups - Small group alternating in-person/virtual

• Gathered • Real-time • Parish/At Home

Age specific ● Non-gathered ● Asynchronous ● At Home

E-Learning Program

Asynchronous ● Age specific ● At Home

Using More than one Model during this year

- Plan B Develop a plan to switch to a different model during the year if needed
- **Blended or Hybrid** Combine two models during year, from the beginning. If circumstances change, continue with the most appropriate model which is already in place.

Multiple Models – Value not only in adaptability to changing circumstances, but opportunity to improve family engagement, to build community among families, to expand use of new catechetical methods and media.
