Lay Parish Ministers in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee

A Study Conducted by Saint Francis Seminary

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INTRODUCTION

The growth of lay ministry has provided a vital resource for the parishes of southeastern Wisconsin. Currently, some 700 individuals serve as paid parish ministers in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

In order to better understand and respond to the formational needs of these individuals and of future parish ministers, Saint Francis Seminary conducted this study of the characteristics, roles, work experience and educational background of lay parish ministers in the archdiocese.

The study focused on those employed, at least part-time, by one or more parishes, to serve in a ministerial role. Most were lay (in the sense of non-ordained), though a few were deacons.

The study did not include priests or deacons except those who served as paid parish staff. It did not include principals, teachers or other school personnel. Nor did it include support staff such as secretaries, bookkeepers or maintenance employees.

The positions of those surveyed included:

In May 2004, 700 questionnaires were mailed to parish ministers listed in the 2004 *Wisconsin Pastoral Handbook*. After eliminating the surveys that were undeliverable and respondents who were not in fact parish ministers, there were 437 actual parish minister respondents for a 65% response rate. (See Appendix I for the survey questionnaire and Appendix II for responses to each question in the questionnaire.)

Numbers of respondents from various ministerial roles are shown in the table below. Directors of religious education were the largest category of respondents (21%), followed by directors of administrative services (15%). Social/human concerns ministry was the least mentioned position (.7%). The role of Hispanic ministry was not listed as a separate item in the survey, but 3 people reported that as their ministry. Both of these latter groups have been included in the "other" category for data analysis purposes.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Gender

Overall, 75% of parish minister respondents were female. In some positions, the proportion of women was even greater, for example, directors of religious education (91%), parish nurses (94%), and liturgy directors (100% of respondents). In a few positions, men accounted for about half of the respondents: music and liturgy directors (51% male, 49% female); parish directors (50% male, 50% female); and directors of administrative service (45% male; 55% female).

Age

Almost one-quarter (24%) of the parish ministers who responded to the survey were 60 years of age or older; another 36% were age 50-59. Only 13% of respondents were under the age of 40.

The age distribution pattern is similar for many parish positions, with pastoral associates and ministers of care being somewhat older on the whole, and music directors and music and liturgy directors being somewhat younger. Youth ministers deviate from overall pattern as the youngest group, with 40% under the age of 40.

Religious Affiliation

By far the majority of parish ministers are Roman Catholic. 97% of all respondents, and more than 92% in any particular parish position, are Catholic.

Language

Only 7% of all respondents are fluent in a language other than English. For those who do speak another language, the primary second language was Spanish. Various other languages were also mentioned, including sign language (2 respondents).

EMPLOYMENT

Full time/Part time Employment

71% of the parish ministers reported that their positions are full time. Positions which deviate from the pattern are parish nurse (89% part time), music director (58% part time), and minister of care (47% part time).

Years in Current Position

Over half (53%) of the parish ministers have been in their positions 5 or fewer years, with 9% in their first year. 25% have been in their parishes for 6-10 years, 22% for more than 10 years.

Prior Experience in Parish Ministry

About half (51%) of the respondents have been employed in one or more parishes prior to their current parish.

Total Years in Parish Ministry

30% have served in parish ministry for 5 years or less. Another 19% have 6-10 years experience. 50% have served in parish ministry for more than 10 years.

It is notable that one-third (33%) of music directors and 40% of music and liturgy directors have been in parish ministry for more that 26 years. On the other end of the spectrum, 50% of the youth ministers have been in parish ministry 5 years or less.

Work Experience Other than Parish Ministry

Three-fourths (75%) of parish ministers reported having worked in a field other than parish ministry sometime in the past. 28% had been employed in a church-based organization, 29% were employed in a for-profit business, and 17% were employed in a non-profit organization, self-employment, or other work.

11% of all parish ministers reported having previously worked in a Catholic school, and another 6% previously served in campus ministry, chaplaincy, social ministry, or a diocesan office.

FORMATION AND EDUCATION

Level and Type of Education

A large segment of parish ministers (36%) reported having a master's degree as their highest degree. 29% reported bachelor's degrees, and 28% reported no post-secondary degree.

Of those reporting a bachelor's degree as their highest degree, only a small percentage (15%) majored in theology, religious studies, or pastoral ministry (compared to 85% with "other" bachelor's degrees).

On the other hand, 65% of those reporting a master's degree as their highest or most recent degree (24% of all respondents) have a master's degree in pastoral ministry, divinity, theology, or religious studies.

Of the 2% of parish ministers reporting a doctorate as their highest or most recent degree, half reported doctorates in ministry or theology.

About 29% of all respondents reported a degree in ministry, theology or religious studies.

As shown in the chart on the following page, respondents in some parish positions reported a much higher proportion of ministry-related degrees. These include adult and family ministers (67%), parish directors (63%) and pastoral associates (60%). On the other hand, music directors and administrative service directors are least likely to have a ministry-related degree (5% and 8% respectively).

Other types of post-secondary education are especially relevant to particular ministries. Among directors of administrative services, 55% reported a business-related degree (6% associate, 36% bachelor's, and 13% master's degree). Among directors of music and directors of music & liturgy, 37% reported a music-related degree (1% associate, 19% bachelor's, and 17% master's degree). And 89% of parish nurses reported a degree in nursing.

Parish ministers with a master's degree in pastoral ministry, theology, or religious studies received their degrees from the following schools. Saint Francis Seminary was by far the leading provider of graduate education among parish ministers, accounting for 36% of graduate degrees in ministry.

Of those with a ministry-related master's degree, 12% have a Master of Divinity. Of these, half are from Saint Francis Seminary. The M.Div is not available to lay ministers through any other Catholic institution in Wisconsin.

Non-degree Education and Certification

Nearly half of the respondents (48%) reported completing one or more types of non-degree education, or earning some form of certification. Some 209 respondents reported having 334 certificates, programs, or certifications. Of these, 43% have religious education certification, 20% had received formation for religious life, 19% completed a lay ministry certificate, and 14% have a youth ministry certificate.

Of those respondents who reported what institution provided their certificate or certification, 56% cited the Archdiocese of Milwaukee (certification of religious educators, youth ministers, administrative service directors, pastoral associates, parish directors, preaching); 15% named Saint Francis Seminary (lay ministry or diaconate formation); 13% Cardinal Stritch University (religious education or youth ministry certificates); and 9% Marquette University (primarily the parish nurse institute).

It is significant that 14% of parish ministers who reported no ministry-related degree did report having completed a certificate program.

Among the schools offering certificate programs, Saint Francis Seminary was the leading provider of non-degree formation for parish ministers (with 31%). The second largest provider was Cardinal Stritch University with 25%.

Current Students

As shown on the table on the following page, 14% of respondents reported that they are currently students. The fields they are studying include ministry, theology or religious studies (7%); spiritual direction (2%); music (2%); and business, education, or nursing (2%).

Of the 56 who reported where they are attending school, 29% are attending Saint Francis Seminary, 13% Cardinal Stritch University, 5% University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, 5% Marquette University, and 5% Sacred Heart School of Theology.

Desire for Additional Formation

Of those responding to a question about the need for additional formation, 30% of parish ministers said their education is adequate, 17% indicated that additional education would be helpful, and more than half (53%) said their current education was adequate but additional education would be helpful. Liturgy directors, music and liturgy directors and youth ministers were above average in reporting a desire for additional education. Respondents in these roles also reported above-average current enrollment in educational programs compared to other areas of ministry.

Additional Education Desired

Respondents reported a desire for various kinds and intensities of education, from workshops and days of reflection to courses to complete degree programs. They said they want practical skills related to their ministries, more extensive theological study, and/or opportunities to meet standards for employment or certification.

Some (5%) indicated a desire to complete a degree--undergraduate, graduate or doctorate. Others (2%) wanted to become certified for a particular ministry--director of religious education, director of administrative services, pastoral associate, parish director or chaplain.

Some (5%) stated a desire or need for education to be offered in particular formats--day or evening classes, summer program, distance education, courses without prerequisites, or individual workshops.

Obstacles to Further Education

Respondents listed 328 barriers to the pursuit of further education. 59% mentioned some combination of time and money. No other obstacles were as prevalent. Family responsibilities (10%) and work responsibilities (8%) were the next most frequently noted issues.

CONCLUDING OBSERVATIONS

Parish ministers present a wealth of experience, education and abilities. Many of the ministers have years of parish experience, and some bring valuable professional experience from other fields. Many hold ministry-related degrees, or have completed a ministry formation program. Some have attained specialized certification in their field of ministry. And some are currently enrolled in an educational program.

However, a significant number of parish ministers do not report any formal preparation for ministry. There is a need--and an expressed desire among many--for appropriate formation.

60% of parish ministers are age 50 and older. These older individuals, representing years of life experience, professional experience, and education (64% of the ministry-related degrees are held by those age 50 and older), are an invaluable resource for the church. However, most of these individuals will likely retire or withdraw from active ministry in the next ten to fifteen years. On the other hand, only 13% of the current parish ministers are under 40, suggesting the need to explore ways to encourage younger individuals to consider parish ministry as a viable career option.

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee is blessed with several institutions which provide ministry formation, theological education, or training in specialized skills. The Archdiocese sponsors Saint Francis Seminary which continues to be the leading source of formation for parish ministers in southeastern Wisconsin. Other Catholic institutions of higher education also contribute by offering degrees in theology or religious studies, certificate programs, or special institutes. Retreat centers, religious communities, and archdiocesan offices are also among the contributors to the formation of today's ministers.

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee faces the challenges of providing formation for growing numbers of parish ministers, addressing the obstacles that individuals face in acquiring formation, and responding in a comprehensive way to ministers' need and desire for spiritual support, theological education, and professional development.
