#### Middle & High School Ministry

#### Gen Z Stats

- 35% feel isolated from others
- 33% feel completely alone
- 45% feel no one understands me
- 58% feel overall stressed and overwhelmed
- Top 3 Priorities (i.e. marks of adulthood)
  - Finish Education (66%)
  - Start Career (66%)
  - Become Financially Independent (65%)

These are all pre-Covid numbers. Essentially, we just lived through an ordeal that specifically targets the weaknesses and hopes of this generation.

Take Away #1: We must be convinced that this generation needs the Gospel in their lives; that a life with Christ is the only way to find fulfillment in this life. In other words - WE NEED YOUTH EVANGELIZATION!

Silver Lining: Covid changes nothing for how we need to respond to Gen Z (there are few "new" problems).

We know many Gen Z'ers are leaving the Church in droves.

- Only 42% of Gen Z identifies as Christian (17% as Catholic)
- 34% identify as "none" highest in any generation.

For the Gen Z'ers who stay and are committed (i.e. do more than attend church regularly, but are engaged and invested in the mission, some 10%):

- 89% believe living in relationship with Jesus is the only way to find fulfillment in life (49% for habitual churchgoers)
- 90% relationship with Jesus brings me deep joy and satisfaction (48%)
- 88% say their Church is a place I feel I belong (43%)
- 85% say there is someone in their life who encourages them to grow spiritually (50%)

Given this, the questions we need to be asking are:

- 1. How do we introduce Gen Z to a lived relationship with Jesus Christ?
- 2. How do we help Gen Z belong?
- 3. How do we challenge Gen Z to grow spiritually?

Takeaway #2: The answers to these questions are the principles of Jesus' mission -

- 1. How do we introduce Gen Z to a lived relationship with Jesus Christ?
  - a. Heart to Heart Ministry
- 2. How do we help Gen Z belong?
  - a. Person to Person Ministry
- 3. How do we challenge Gen Z to grow spiritually?
  - a. Communion to Commission intentional discipleship through Call/Form/Send.

#### Takeaway #3: Now is the time to shift how we think about Youth Ministry.

- 1. Prioritize helping teens belong and feel known
  - a. Middle School large group community
  - b. High School smaller groups with stable leaders
    - i. Establish Small Groups *this Fall* so that they are solidified if you need to move online in the late Fall/Winter
  - c. Emphasize names, hospitality, and community
  - d. Do not merely send recordings/videos home via email to complete (virtual formation)
  - e. How often to meet to feel known?
- 2. Focus on relationships and helping individuals grow
  - a. Priority 1: Core Team Adult Leaders
  - b. Priority 2: Parents
  - c. Priority 3: Teen leaders
- 3. Make every aspect of Youth Ministry about relationship
  - a. Service: talk about it
  - b. Retreats: have follow ups; get in small groups
    - i. Utilize same leaders for all these areas
  - c. Train leaders to do relational ministry
  - d. Leverage existing relationships (teachers, parents, sponsors)
- 4. Cut out aspects of work that keep you from relational ministry
  - a. Lean on programs that have good training for leaders
    - i. Life Teen, YDisicple, Alpha
  - b. Lean on programs that provide excellent content to free you up for relationships
  - c. Tracking retreats, service, etc.
    - i. Good intention (exposing teens to this), but not effective.
    - ii. Form leaders to help their small groups experience things
- 5. PRAY for creative solutions to any obstacles you might encounter
  - a. Not able to meet in church/school buildings
  - b. Not having enough leaders
