Submit Current 4th - 7th Grade Student Information by March 31

New and Improved Process

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee has a goal for 100% of grade schools and religious education programs to submit current 4th – 7th grade student data by March 31, 2020. Having this accurate information will benefit students, religious education children and families so they can become aware about opportunities regarding Catholic high school summer camps, open houses, shadow days and more.

The process for collecting names has changed to make it easier for you. We are no longer requesting you enter names in the Archmil Names Database. Student information can now be emailed to Dale Klein, archdiocesan information systems specialist, as an export from your student information system or parish management system, or in an Excel or CSV format. However, we need the field columns that you submit to be in this EXACT format, with one column for each piece of 4th-7th grade student data:

- 1. Last name
- 2. First name
- 3. Address
- 4. City
- 5. State
- 6. Zip
- 7. Gender (ONLY use the label boy or girl)
- 8. Grade level
- 9. Parish name or school name
- 10. City of parish or school

Here are some guidelines for submitting student data. (If you have already entered your students into the Names Database this year, there is no need to send us the information again. We will pull your students from the Names Database.)

- 1. If your religious education program maintains student data in a Parish Management System such as ParishSoft, PDS, Realm, Gabriel, etc., please export the data, format it as requested above, and email the Excel or CSV file to Dale Klein.
- 2. If you keep track of your students in an Excel spreadsheet or Google Doc, please make sure it is formatted as requested above and email the Excel or CSV file to Dale Klein.

Safe Environment Week 2020 Resource Guide

The Safe Environment Week Resource Guide for this year was sent out last week to all pastors, parish directors, directors of religious education, safe environment coordinators, youth ministers, and principals. Please review the guide and select the resources that will be best to use for your parish and school. Safe Environment Week is April 19th-25th this year. This year's theme for Safe Environment week is: "Yet greater still is the light of Christ." — Pope Francis

Circles of Grace Grade Level Curriculum for children's safe environment lessons

Archbishop Listecki and the Diocesan Review Board has approved the use of the Circle of Grace curriculum from the Archdiocese of Omaha. This grade level curriculum will be the only curriculum promulgated by the Archbishop for use in our archdiocese. A promulgation letter will be going out in April 2020, and This curriculum is being provided to you at no cost to your parish or school. A training is being scheduled for this summer for anyone interested in learning more about how to use the curriculum in your programs or classrooms. We will also have a webinar available with an implementation workshop that will be in the fall for any program directors or principals.

In regards to any other curriculums that you may be using to teach your grade level safe environment lessons, we will be reviewing what parishes and schools used this past year and reported on the safe environment curriculum verification reports that DRE's and principals turn into the catechesis office and schools office respectively. We will be having an advisory group assembled to review the various curriculums/lesson plans used to make sure that parishes and schools have alternative options for curriculums that are still meeting safe environment requirements and are considered best practice in child safety education.

More information will be coming regarding this curriculum and it's implementation.

Children's Safe Environment Lessons Scheduled during Closures

If you had children's safe environment lessons scheduled this month for your religious education programs and classes are cancelled, you may either reschedule those lessons for a later date or provide the lessons to the parents to teach at home with a requirement to have the parent confirm that they have taught the lesson at home with their child and the date they taught the lesson. Please keep all documentation regarding rescheduled lessons in case they are needed for review. The Safe Environment Office recommends that every effort be made to reschedule the lesson, if possible.


