Planning for the Fall

As we prepare to launch faith formation programs this year, there is once again some uncertainty about the health situation. On the one hand, many adults are getting vaccinated, so we do not face the same risks as last year. On the other hand, there is a new variation of the virus, a resurgence of infection in many places, and no vaccine yet for children. So we still need to be thoughtful and

intentional about how we bring young people together in-person.

We do not have archdiocesan-wide directives or restrictions for parishes to follow. There are simply too many different situations around the archdiocese. We encourage local decision making. It is still important to exercise appropriate care in planning your programs.

- In general, plan for in-person programs, but remember that conditions may change and require a change in plans in the future.
- It is the expectation that all Catholic parishes will follow their local municipal orders if any are in place.
- Plan in collaboration with your pastor, parish director and other parish leaders. Consistency among various aspects of parish life is helpful.
- Decisions on wearing of facemasks, practicing distancing or other restrictions are up to the pastor, administrator, or parish director.
- There is NO special COVID-19 Consent Form for parents to sign this year.
- Learn what your school district is doing, especially schools attended by families in your program.
- If your parish is associated with a Catholic School, learn about their protocols, and plan early for use of any common rooms and facilities.
- Check with nearby parishes too, so that, if appropriate, there is parish-to-parish consistency.
- It may be helpful to consult with a few trusted parents in your program.
- Continue to maintain cleaning protocols and to provide hand sanitizer.
- Remind parents that, if their child is exhibiting COVID symptoms or is under a quarantine period, they should not participate in parish functions.
- Some people will not be comfortable in a public setting without face coverings or social distancing. We must continue to treat everyone with dignity and respect.
- Inform parents what kind of environment and practices they can expect for their children. Even though special consent forms are not used, parents still need information so they can make informed decisions about their child's participation.

Preparing and Celebrating Catechetical Sunday 2021

Catechetical Sunday is just short of one month away – **September 19, 2021**. This year’s theme is “Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed / Una Palabra Tuya Bastará para Sanarme.” These words which we pray at Mass are especially relevant in these times. Our need for healing became so evident this past year. We seek healing individually, as families, as a society, even as church communities. We turn to Jesus, the “Divine Physician,” to beg for healing. But we turn to him in confidence, like the centurion whose words we allude to (Mt 8:8), asking only that Jesus say the word, knowing he can heal beyond our expectations.

This also serves as a reminder that our own ministry must be a healing ministry. The hurts and weakness of our people can be an obstacle to full engagement, learning and growth. They need healing first. Do they find in us, in our gatherings, in our programs, a healing word? Do they encounter the Lord who can strengthen and heal them? As we attend to all the organizational details, the hospitality, and program content, let’s not forget to also be a healing presence to those we encounter.
