



## High Risk Activities

For field trips, excursions, and community service opportunities that involve high risk activities, each high risk activity must be individually identified, and parent or guardian permission must be given or denied for each individually identified high risk activity. Page 2 of Form 6153(a) and page 3 of form 6153(b) shall be used for this purpose. The parent or guardian must sign the bottom of this page as well.

The following are some examples of high risk activities. This is not an exhaustive list. Any questions regarding potential activities that may be classified as high risk should be addressed with our Catholic Mutual Group representative.

- Downhill skiing
- High ropes course
- Hiking or walking or biking on roads in areas without a designated pedestrian or bike path.
  - A bike lane on a road is considered high risk.
- Horseback riding
- Roller skating
- Trampoline park activities
- Snowboarding
- Vertical climbing wall
- Water activities – boating, swimming, and / or water rides

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
