Dear Friends of the Diaconate.

Fall 2017 will mark the last year (2017—2018) of formation for the eight men in the Class of 2018 who anticipate ordination in September of 2018. The Aspirant Class of 2016-2017 is now the future Deacon Class of 2020. Nine of the aspirants were selected (see page 4) to move forward and celebrate the *Rite of Candidacy for Ordination to Holy Orders* on September 9, 2017 in the Mater Christi Chapel in the ACCC. Admissions for the future Deacon Class of 2022 will begin in January 2018.

So there are always lots of changes and people coming and going here behind the scenes in the ODF "...where love becomes service..." in order to prepare servants for the Church. Thank you to all of you who help to make our mission a success!

C.O.A.S: Committee on Admission and Scrutiny / Comité de Admisión y Escrutinio

One of the important "bodies" in the formation of deacons is a group of people selected to evaluate, discern and make recommendations to the Archbishop in regard to our Aspirants and Candidates.

The National Directory for the Formation, Life and Ministry of the Permanent Deacon in the USA (The Directory) established that each diocese creates a committee that will be responsible to assess the readiness or suitability of each man discerning the vocation to the diaconate. This group is called C.O.A.S: Committee on Admission and Scrutiny.

Our C.O.A.S. includes permanent deacons, deacon wives, a canonist, a priest, the Director of Formation, the Rector of Saint Francis De Sales Seminary, educators/theologians and lay ministers. Each one of them share their wisdom and knowledge from their respective areas of expertise while also bringing real life experiences to advise the Archbishop in his process of assessment and selection of men for the different paths of formation.

The Directory states that "...the committee should nominate to the bishop only those applicants whom they have judged as possessing the necessary qualities for entrance and successful completion..." of the formation paths: aspirancy, candidacy, *Institution to Reader*, *Institution to Acolyte* and *Holy Orders*. "Upon reviewing the recommendation, vote, and rationale of the committee, the bishop is the one who decides whether to admit [and advance] the applicant..." (cfr. #180 of the Directory)

The C.O.A.S. meets periodically throughout the year to evaluate and discern the progress of the men selected by the Archbishop, confirming the readiness and suitability of each individual within their respective paths.

We extend our full, heartfelt gratitude to each member of this committee for their wisdom and support to the Formation Program. We are grateful for those who have retired from their responsibilities, for those who continue to be part of this mission, and for our new members. To all THANK YOU!

PISCERNMENT

Uno de los "cuerpos" importantes en la formación de los diáconos es un grupo de personas seleccionadas para evaluar, discernir y hacer recomendaciones a nuestro Arzobispo con respecto a nuestros Aspirantes y Candidatos.

El Directorio Nacional para la Formación, Vida y Ministerio del Diácono Permanente en los Estados Unidos (El Directorio) estableció que cada diócesis crea un comité que será responsable de evaluar la disponibilidad o idoneidad de cada hombre discerniendo la vocación al diaconado. Este grupo se llama Comité de Admisión y Escrutinio (C.O.A.S por sus siglas en inglés).

El COAS incluye a Diáconos permanentes; Esposas de los Diáconos, Canonistas, Sacerdotes, Directores de Formación (incluyendo al Rector del Seminario de la Arquidiócesis de Milwaukee), Educadores, Teólogos, etc. Cada uno de ellos ofrece su sabiduría y conocimiento en sus respectivas áreas para ayudar al arzobispo en su selección de hombres para las diferentes etapas de esta formación. Esto le ofrecerá todo lo que es necesario saber sobre el individuo y su idoneidad para estar en formación y convertirse en un diácono.

El Directorio declaró que "... el comité debe presentar a l obispo sólo aquellos aspirantes que ellos juzguen que posean las cualidades necesarias para entrar y completar satisfactoriamente..." las etapas de la formación. "Después de revisar la recomendación, el voto y el raciocinio del comité, el obispo es quien decide admitir al solicitante..." (cfr. # 180 del Directorio)

El COAS continúan reuniéndose cada año para evaluar y discernir sobre cada uno de los hombres seleccionados por el Arzobispo, evaluando la preparación de cada individuo. El comité hace recomendaciones en todas las etapas del camino de formación: Aspirantado, Candidatura, Institución al Acolitado, Institución al Lectorado y Ordenación.

Extendemos de todo corazón nuestro agradecimiento a todos los miembros de este comité por su sabiduría y apoyo a nuestro Programa de Formación. Estamos agradecidos por aquellos que se retiraron de sus responsabilidades; por aquellos que siguen siendo parte de esta misión y por aquellos recién llegados. A todos GRACIAS!

Meet Our Deacons

The process of discernment for the Diaconate begins long before any formal contact is made with the Office for Diaconate Formation. Those considering the Diaconate should first reflect on their qualifications, and decide whether they are suited to serve. Our office provides resources online or "in person" to help a man with his discernment. Those interested in knowing more about the vocation to the diaconate should:

- Visit our website to read about the diaconate and look at our resources or
- ♦ Contact our office to ask for the resources
- Make an appointment with our office to talk about the diaconate
- Participate in the "Inquiry for Discernment Program" that is offered in different regions in our Archdiocese with their spouse (if married).

Our office has a great "Discernment Team" of Deacons and their wives that offer their time, knowledge and wisdom to help men and their wives (if they are married) to discern the vocation to the diaconate.
